If these conditions are not met, continued participation in this program and acceptance to SUNY College at Geneseo will be in jeopardy.

4. Students interested in teaching must submit a separate application to SUNY Geneseo's teacher certification program. Applications for admission to teacher certification programs are due Dec.1 for spring admission and April 15 for fall admission. Specific coursework and minimum 3.0 GPA are required for acceptance into the program. For additional information, go to http://education.geneseo.edu or SUNY Geneseo's catalog.

- 5. SUNY Geneseo requires students complete a minimum 15-hour experience working with children in a structured, academic setting in grades 7-12 prior to applying to the Adolescent Education program.

7. Students not intending to graduate from FLCC prior to transferring to SUNY College at Geneseo should select two science courses with different prefixes.
