BCTC – UK Pathway to Transfer Sheet Associate of Arts for Political Science

Suggested Course Sequence for Smooth Transfer

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy both the requirements for an Associate of Arts degree at BCTC as well as the USP requirements for the University of Kentucky and the pre-major requirements for the Bachelor's degree in Political Science.

Political Science is a major in the College of Arts and Sciences, and therefore the requirements for the College of Arts and Sciences must be fulfilled to complete the Bachelor's degree. One of the A&S requirements is that students complete the fourth college semester of a single foreign language, or if the student had 2 years of a foreign language in high school, they could complete the third college semester of a second foreign language. The suggested curriculum below would satisfy the College of Arts & Sciences foreign language requirement.
