## **Transfer Agreement**

# Kentucky State University Bachelor of Arts in Psychology And Kentucky Community and Technical College System Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, and Associate in Applied Science in Human Services

The Kentucky Postsecondary Education Improvement Act of 1997 mandates a seamless system of postsecondary education that can only be achieved by promoting ease of transfer for learners among Kentucky institutions. Further, there is a need for a well-educated populace in Kentucky and an increase in the capacity to deliver programs to underserved citizens.

In order to promote the transfer of credits among Kentucky State University and KCTCS and increase educational opportunities through online course delivery; KSU and KCTCS establish this transfer agreement. This transfer agreement allows students to transfer the Associate of Arts, Associate of Science and/or the Associate of Applied Science degree in Human Services toward the degree requirements of the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology as outlined in this agreement. KCTCS students who transfer under the provisions of this agreement may need to complete general education courses beyond those required for the Associate of Applied Science degree requirements in order to meet bachelor's degree program requirements.

The provisions of the agreement are applicable to students who complete course requirements inperson, online, or a combination of in-person and online enrollment.

KCTCS students must apply for admission to KSU and have official transcripts forwarded to the admissions office directly from a KCTCS college. Students who have met the admission requirements for the bachelor's degree may take KSU and KCTCS courses concurrently if prerequisites have been met. Credits accumulated from other institutions will be accepted following review of the credits for their appropriateness and applicability to the program. A required minor may be completed in one of the other online programs offered through the KYVU or through more traditional means.

KCTCS students who transfer under the provisions of this agreement will need to complete the upper division courses from KSU as specified in the agreement in order to meet the requirements for the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology. Courses required to complete the curriculum may be taken through online offerings from other accredited institutions, including those institutions that have entered transfer agreements with KSU for upper-division psychology courses.

Both institutions agree to monitor and support the provisions of this agreement to ensure consistency, program quality and transferability for the mutual benefit of the students enrolled at the institutions.

KCTCS and KSU agree to coordinate changes in course content or requirements for any course listed in the transfer agreement in order to ensure continued compatibility among the courses offered by the departments at each institution.

KCTCS and KSU agree to renegotiate this agreement as necessary due to changes in course content or graduation requirements at either of the institutions.

Both institutions will observe SACS and other discipline-specific accreditation as well all CPE guidelines and rules, and agree to adhere to CPE requirements for reporting transfer information.

In the event that KSU determines that it will no longer offer the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology, the university will provide one-year notice of the termination of the degree program. All students enrolled in the program will be given a reasonable amount of time to complete degree requirements.
