

The Transfer Student and Admission

An applicant is considered a transfer student when he or she has attended another regionally accredited post-secondary institution in any capacity after completing high school.

To be considered for admission, the transfer applicant should have earned a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA or a "C" average in at least two full-time semesters of course work (24 semester credits) or its equivalent from regionally accredited colleges. Applicants who have earned less than 24 semester credits or its equivalent must meet both transfer and freshman admission requirements. Freshman applicants age 22 or older are not required to submit SAT or ACT scores. (See *Coastal Carolina University Catalog* for complete freshman admission information.)

For admission to Coastal Carolina University from another institution, a transfer student must:

- Complete an application for admission and submit a nonrefundable application fee
- Provide official copies of transcripts from all previously attended institutions directly to the Office of Admissions
- Be academically eligible to return to the last institution attended as a degree candidate (e.g., not on academic or disciplinary suspension)

Decisions for admission are made after all official credentials are received.

Transfer Policy

Coastal Carolina University has adopted the following policy for determining transfer of academic credits from regionally accredited institutions:

- 1. A student transferring to Coastal Carolina University will submit all official transcripts to the Office of Admissions for evaluation.
- Up to 76 transferable credits of college parallel courses may be accepted from one or more South Carolina technical colleges or regionally accredited two-year college transfer programs to be applicable toward a Coastal Carolina University degree.
- Up to 90 transferable credits of college parallel courses may be accepted from one or more regionally accredited four-year colleges or universities to be applicable toward a Coastal Carolina University degree.
- 4. Prior to graduating from Coastal Carolina University and regardless of the point in the student's academic career at which any student enters the University, the student must complete the last 30 semester hours while enrolled in classes at Coastal Carolina University or through sanctioned Coastal Carolina University academic exchange programs.
- A minimum grade of "C" (e.g., C-, C or C+) in a course is required for transfer credit to be awarded for that course.
- Credit for work completed at another institution by Coastal Carolina University students will not be accepted for transfer credit if the student has previously failed to earn the required grade in an equivalent course at Coastal Carolina University.
- Credit for work completed at another institution or by correspondence of any
 origin will not be accepted when the student earned the credit while on academic
 suspension from Coastal Carolina University.

Transcript Evaluation

The Office of Admissions will complete a preliminary evaluation of transcripts to identify courses that can transfer for credit to Coastal Carolina University. An official list of those transferable credits is then forwarded to all accepted transfer students. Refer to the list of approved courses for transfer in this guide (pages 51-60).

The department chair or adviser evaluates specific courses, as needed, and determines which course credits apply to that particular major.

If a student later decides to change his/her major, a re-evaluation of applicable credits must be completed by the department chair of the new major.

Transfer Credit Restrictions

As a general rule, credits earned in courses that apply to one or more of the following categories are usually not acceptable for transfer credit:

- Courses that are occupational or technical in nature
- Courses that are essentially remedial
- Courses not recognized in that institution's catalog as part of its college parallel transfer program

Exceptions to the above categories may be made only by the dean or designee of the college in which the student plans to enroll (major), by the dean or designee of the college that offers the course, or by the Interdisciplinary Studies Committee in specific cases where such courses are judged to be uniquely relevant to the student's degree program.

Certain degree programs do not recognize some transfer credit from two-year institutions for courses which are considered upper division or upper level courses at Coastal Carolina University. However, some degree programs will grant transfer credit for such courses as lower level electives or core curriculum requirements. Each transfer student is encouraged to discuss the transfer of academic credits not listed in this guide with department contacts (see pages 13-14) or with his/her adviser, who is assigned by the dean of the student's major. Students should be aware that changing their majors while at Coastal Carolina University will require a re-evaluation and approval of their transfer credits for application to their new majors.

Calculation of Coastal Carolina University **Grade Point Average**

Coastal Carolina University accepts the credit only for transfer, not the grade for grade point average (GPA) calculation. (A student's GPA is calculated on Coastal Carolina University courses only, except when a student graduates with honors. In this case, **all** collegiate work, including transfer grades, are calculated in the GPA.)

The GPA is calculated on the basis of all work in the student's career at Coastal Carolina University. All credits earned at other institutions and transferred to Coastal Carolina University may be used to satisfy program requirements but will not be calculated as a part of the GPA.

However, graduation with honors will be based on a collegiate GPA calculated on the basis of *all* work in the student's postsecondary career, including any courses attempted at other institutions, provided that the GPA achieved at Coastal Carolina University meets the level specified for the honors sought. This calculation will include all courses attempted, not just those submitted in fulfillment of graduation requirements.

The following designations indicate a consistently high level of academic achievement throughout the student's entire academic career. To graduate with such honors, a student must have earned at least 60 credit hours applicable toward the degree "in residence," meaning at Coastal Carolina University (which can include credits earned through sanctioned Coastal Carolina University academic exchange programs). Courses taken as a transient (visiting) student at other institutions, by correspondence, by examination (departmental or CLEP), by exemption, or earned through military credits are not considered "in residence."

➤ Summa Cum Laude: collegiate GPA of 4.0
 ➤ Magna Cum Laude: collegiate GPA of 3.75-3.99
 ➤ Cum Laude: collegiate GPA of 3.5-3.74

Academic Forgiveness

"Academic Forgiveness" for former Coastal Carolina University students means that a student's past failures are forgiven to allow him/her to resume a college career with a realistic possibility of completing a degree. The program allows the calculation of a GPA based on the student's performance in courses taken after being granted forgiveness. See the *Coastal Carolina University Catalog* for conditions to apply for academic forgiveness and circumstances following approval.

A student who has met the conditions must submit a written request to the dean of the student's major.

Core Curriculum

The purpose of the core curriculum is to provide an educational experience in the liberal arts tradition that encourages and supports free inquiry, critical thinking, effective communication, and creativity. Persons educated in the liberal arts will have the opportunity to explore and cultivate an understanding of the multiple aspects of human culture and the natural world. The core curriculum is designed to prepare students for a thoughtful and productive life by exposing them to the methods of inquiry and practice of the humanities, sciences and arts. Upon successful completion of the core, the students of Coastal Carolina University will develop the skills necessary to think clearly and logically, to gather and analyze information, and to express themselves effectively. As well rounded individuals, our students will possess the qualities needed to excel in their chosen fields of study and to live conscientious, responsible lives.

Goals, Student Learning Outcomes and Requirements

1. Knowledge of Effective Communication. Educated persons should have the ability to comprehend, analyze and critically evaluate language, and to express themselves clearly and effectively. Educated persons should be skilled in reading, writing and thinking critically. (6-9 credit hours)

Students may exempt (without credit) ENGL 101 under the following conditions:

- 1. Report a score of 600 or higher on the SAT Writing Test
- 2. Report a score of 24 or higher on the ACT Writing Test

All students are required to complete either ENGL 102 or ENGL 211 with a "C" or better in order to fulfill this core goal.

Part B:

Three (3) additional credit hours shall be taken in a course for communicating in the disciplines. This course may, but does not have to be discipline specific, i.e., it may be communicating in the social sciences or communicating in the natural sciences. All courses with this designation will apply to this core requirement.

2. Knowledge of Mathematical Concepts. Educated persons should have the ability to solve numerical problems, understand and apply mathematical concepts, and develop quantitative skills. An understanding of these concepts is fundamental for living in a complex society. (3-4 credit hours)

Educated persons should have the ability to identify, collect, interpret and evaluate scientific evidence and apply the basic laws of science to the natural world. These abilities provide a basis for understanding scientific concepts and the dynamic processes that shape and maintain the universe. (4 credit hours)

4. Knowledge of Humanistic Concepts. Educated persons should gain the ability to recognize, interpret and evaluate humanistic thought and expression from a variety of viewpoints. This leads to an understanding of the philosophical, religious, literary, ethical, cultural and other humanistic concepts through which human beings interpret and judge themselves and their world. Students must take one course from two of the three disciplines represented. (6 credit hours)

5. Knowledge of the Cultures, Languages and Social Structures of Other

Countries of the World. Educated persons should gain a basic knowledge of the world and the ability to learn from the practice of other languages and cultures. This leads to an awareness and understanding of other world cultures and languages, which foster diversity and help promote global citizenship. (See Part A and Part B requirements identified below; 6-9 credit hours.)

Student Learning Outcomes

- Demonstrate a basic knowledge of cultures and social structures of other countries of the world.
- 2. Demonstrate the ability to learn from the practice of other languages.
- 3. Demonstrate the ability to learn from the practice of other cultures.

Financial Aid, Scholarships and Veteran Affairs

Graduation Requirements

It is recommended that students meet with their faculty advisers at least once each semester. In order to be eligible for graduation, students must meet all course requirements, meet all "in residence" requirements, meet all departmental or program requirements, meet all core curriculum requirements and have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 on all work attempted at Coastal Carolina University.

All course credit beyond 90 hours must be Coastal Carolina University courses completed "in residence" at the University, and at least 12 credits of the student's major courses and six (6) credits of cognate or minor courses must be earned at Coastal Carolina University. Some programs impose greater student residence and/or major and minor requirements. Consult the *Coastal Carolina University Catalog*.

A maximum of 90 transferable semester credit hours of college parallel courses may be accepted from one or more regionally accredited four-year colleges to be applicable towards a Coastal Carolina University degree.

A maximum of 76 transferable semester credit hours of college parallel courses may be accepted from one or more regionally accredited South Carolina technical colleges or two-year institutions to apply toward a Coastal Carolina University degree.

Regardless of when students enter the University, **they must complete the last 30 credit hours** before graduation enrolled in classes approved by the appropriate chair of the department from which the degree will be granted. All degree applicants are urged to confer with the chairs of their respective departments about their programs and degree requirements prior to the beginning of their last two semesters "in residence" at the University to ensure completion of all requirements.

Some departments have specific requirements for graduation as part of the department's other requirements. For example, art majors must submit portfolios for faculty review at the end of their sophomore year and also prepare to display their work in a senior art show. English majors must score a passing grade on the English assessment exam in addition to the English degree's other requirements.

Students are responsible for their individual academic program and for meeting the requirements of their major department and the University.


