Section I: Description

The intent of this agreement is to facilitate the transfer process from the Associate of General Studies (AGS) Degree in Criminal Justice at Pueblo Community College (PCC) to the University of Southern Colorado (USC) Bachelor of Science (BS) in Sociology/Criminology. Students who complete the requirements in this articulation agreement will be granted junior standing at USC, providing that all courses are earned with a grade of "C" or better.

This agreements identifies two parts of requirements for the student:

1. Part I, to be completed at PCC, will consist of the general education requirements and selected lower division Criminal Justice courses required to complete the PCC AGS degree.

2. Part II, to be completed at USC, will consist of a) upper division Sociology/Criminology requirements and b) other requirements necessary for graduation.

Section II: Program Requirements

General Education Requirements

The AGS Criminal Justice degree requires 34 credits of general education courses. The courses chosen for the AGS general education requirements also fulfill the General Education Transfer Core. By completing the General Education Transfer Core, students will ensure that their USC general education requirements have been met.

Section IV: Scholarship Incentive

PCC students completing the PCC requirements, as prescribed in this agreement, with a cumulative grade point average of 3.50 and higher will receive a \$500 per semester renewable scholarship if they apply through the Destination USC Program. A GPA of less than 3.50 may not be rounded up. The scholarship will be identified as a Destination USC Scholarship and all eligibility and renewal requirements are applicable.

This articulation agreement replaces all previous articulation agreements between the PCC AGS-Criminal Justice degree and the USC Bachelor's of Science in Sociology degree.
