ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS:

Application deadline is on or before February 1st to be considered for admission into the Clinical Dental Hygiene Program which begins at the end of May in the Summer Semester. The UDM Clinical Dental Hygiene Program does not keep a waiting list. Admission is competitive and starts anew each year based on the most qualified candidates. To be considered for admission into the Clinical Dental Hygiene Program, prospective students must complete (or be in the process of completing) all prerequisite courses. A minimum GPA of 2.7 is expected in overall College GPA, Science GPA, and Prerequisite GPA. In addition, as a requirement of the University, all Pre-Dental Hygiene applicants with less than 24 transferable credit hours and who are under the age of 24 must submit ACT/SAT scores.
