Advising Notes for A.S. Program:

- The BPS degree program can only be completed on a part-time basis through University College, Syracuse University. Syracuse University defines a “part-time student” as a student who is registered for 11 credits or less per semester.
- Students are subject to Syracuse University’s normal admissions criteria.
- Transfer credit is allowed only for those courses in which a grade of “C” or better has been earned. Courses in which a grade of “C-” or lower has been received will not transfer. Course in which a grade of “Pass” is received must be certified to be a C or higher to be accepted.
- Any student who completes a calculus course numbered MA 245 and above with a grade of C or better is thereby exempt from the need to take an additional course to complete the Quantitative Skills Requirement
