Transfer Articulation Agreement

Canisius College and Jamestown Community College

Business Curriculum

June 5, 2006

- Purpose: Jamestown Community College and Canisius College are entering into this agreement to facilitate the opportunities for students who wish to transfer from the Jamestown Community College's Business Administration (A.S.) and Business Administration (A.A.S.) programs to the Richard J. Wehle School of Business at Canisius College. This agreement specifies the conditions and requirements necessary for those students to transfer to Canisius College with advanced standing in the departments and programs listed below.
- 2) Changes: Neither party may change the agreement unilaterally. Proposed changes in policies or curricula by either party must be communicated in writing to the other party and agreed upon in consultation with relevant officials of each institution. Any changes agreed upon must be signed, dated, and attached to this agreement.
- 3) **Notice of Cancellation:** Either party may independently cancel this agreement by notifying the other party no less than one year before the intended date of cancellation.
- 4) **Period:** This agreement is in effect for a period of four years from the date of signatures. This agreement must be renewed every four years by an exchange of correspondence between the Academic Vice Presidents of each institution. Failure to renew constitutes the cancellation of this agreement.
- 5) General Requirements: All students transferring to Canisius College from a two year college must meet the following general requirements:
 - a) Students must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.0 scale.
 - b) Canisius accepts transfer credits only, not the course grades.
 - c) A maximum of 20 courses and 66 credits will be accepted.

- d) Students who have an Associate Degree in Business Administration from Jamestown Community College will be guaranteed admission and will be granted full junior status at Canisius College and all credits will be accepted towards a Canisius degree.*
- 6) **Programs Included:** This agreement includes all of the majors offered by the Wehle School of Business, Canisius College.
- Publication: Jamestown Community College retains the right to use this agreement and the name of Canisius College in the official Jamestown Community College Catalog and promotional literature. The name of Canisius College may be used by Jamestown Community College in recruitment or advisement sessions with individual persons.

*Completion of a bachelor's degree in business may require more than sixty hours of work at Canisius depending on the major pursued and the student's preparation. Students should consult with their transfer advisor concerning requirements for their intended major at Canisius in order to make the transfer as efficient as possible. A list of equivalent courses has been appended to this agreement.
