

## Articulation Agreements between Alan Hancock College, Cuesta College, Santa Barbara City College and California Lutheran University

### TRANSFER ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

In order to assist students as they prepare to transfer, California Lutheran University, Alan Hancock College, Cuesta College and Santa Barbara City College have entered into the general education and course-to-course articulation agreements listed in this publication. These agreements replace all previous articulation agreements.

#### Transfers from Community Colleges

If you have attended or currently are attending a community college, admission to Cal Lutheran is guaranteed if you have met the following admission requirements:

- > Freshman English (college level composition) with a grade of 'C' or better
- > Successful completion of a college level math course
- > 28 transferable units
- > A 2.75 cumulative transferable GPA

If you have not met the criteria for guaranteed admission, you may still be considered for admission as follows:

- > If you have not completed a college level math course, you may be considered for admission if you have successfully completed intermediate algebra in college. No credit will be given for intermediate algebra because it is not a transferable course. It is the prerequisite for all of Cal Lutheran's college level math courses and is therefore the minimum level of math required for admission. If you have not completed at least intermediate algebra in college, you will not be eligible for admission.
- > If you have completed fewer than 28 transferable units, your high school grades and SAT/ACT scores will also be used in the admission decision. You must still meet the math, English, and GPA requirements as listed above. If you were not eligible for admission to Cal Lutheran from high school, you must meet the 28 transferable unit minimum.

#### Transferability of Prior Coursework

Community college courses that are transferable to the UC or CSU system are generally transferable to Cal Lutheran. Courses that are technical, vocational, or for personal enrichment are not transferable, nor are internships. Courses that are transferable but do not meet Cal Lutheran's general education or major requirements will be credited as elective courses, and will be counted toward the total number of units needed for graduation. A maximum of 70 community college credits may be transferred. Pass/Fail or Credit/No Credit transfer credits may not be used to meet general education or major requirements. Courses from non-accredited colleges are not transferable.

**IGETC** — Cal Lutheran accepts IGETC certification for either CSU or UC. Students must be IGETC certified **prior to enrolling** at Cal Lutheran in order to get credit for IGETC certification. Students with IGETC certification will have their remaining general education courses at Cal Lutheran waived except speech, foreign language, and religion. Students with IGETC certification must also meet Cal Lutheran's GPA requirement. Cal Lutheran will need proof of the student's IGETC certification.

AA Degrees — Cal Lutheran evaluates credit on a course by course basis, not based on any degrees earned previously. Students with an AA degree must still meet Cal Lutheran's English, math and GPA requirements for transfer.

**AP Credit** —Cal Lutheran gives credit for AP courses based only on AP exam scores. Students who have taken AP exams need to have an official copy of their scores sent to Cal Lutheran in order to receive credit. Cal Lutheran has an AP test score guide available for those who are interested to see what credit they will be given for their scores.

	Cal Lutheran recommends applying as early as possible as registration, housing, and finan- cial aid are on a first-come, first-served basis. Students applying after the late admission deadline will receive a reduced financial aid package. Cal Lutheran reserves the right to stop accepting applications for a particular semester at an earlier date if enrollment reaches capacity. <b>Applications will not be accepted after the late admission deadline</b> .
GENERAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM	All students must complete at least 124 semester units to graduate from Cal Lutheran, including their general education and major/minor requirements, and at least 40 of these must be upper division (300 or 400 level courses). Below is Cal Lutheran's general education curriculum.

VISITING CAL LUTHERAN	If you are interested in visiting Cal Lutheran, you will need to call our admission office at 805-493- 3135 or 877-258-3678 (toll free) to set up your visit. Your visit may include meeting with an admission counselor, a tour of our campus, sitting in on a class, lunch in the cafeteria, staying overnight in a residence hall, or meeting a coach or faculty member. IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT YOU LET THE PERSON SCHEDULING YOUR VISIT KNOW WHAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO INCLUDE IN YOUR VISIT. If you simply call and schedule an appointment, you will just have a meeting with an admission counselor. We ask that you give us at least a week's notice if you are interested in meeting with faculty, coaches, or an overnight stay to give our staff enough time to coordinate all aspects of your visit.
COUNSELOR APPOINTMENT	If you are interested in meeting with an admission counselor at Cal Lutheran, please call and schedule an appointment and bring with you complete transcripts from all colleges attended. For this meeting, you may bring unofficial transcripts. This will allow the admission counselor to do a preliminary credit evaluation for you. The evaluation will show how many transferable units you have, what your transfer- able GPA is, which of Cal Lutheran's general education course requirements you have met and which are still outstanding.

#### WHICH MATH COURSE SHOULD I TAKE?

The following math courses are required for specific majors. All other majors have no math requirement. Students must therefore only meet the general education math requirement, be satisfied with any transferable math course.

- \* Finite Math: For Business Administration and Economics majors
- \* Pre-calculus: For Exercise Science and Sports Medicine majors
- \* Topics in Liberal Arts Math: For Liberal Studies majors
- ✤ Discrete Math: For Computer Science majors
- Calculus: Required for Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, Biology, Chemistry, Geology, Math, and Physics majors
- Susiness Calculus: Required for Business Administration majors with a Finance Emphasis

#### EXERCISE SCIENCE AND SPORTS MEDICINE MAJORS

The following support courses are required for ESSM majors. Because of the sequential nature of science courses, it is highly recommended that students take these courses prior to transferring. The Lifeguarding and Swimming Instructor Certifications are not prerequisites for transfer but must be obtained outside of CLU due to the current lack of aquatics facilities.

#### Foreign Language (French, German, Spanish)

Should have at least one year of the language in college if transferring as a sophomore (28-57 transferable units) and at least two years of the language if transferring as a junior (58-89 transferable units).

\*The Social Science Waiver is for students interested in teaching Middle School or High School History and/or Social Sciences including Geography, Political Science, Economics, Psychology, and Sociology.
