## Articulation Agreement between

Florence-Darlington Technical College and Morris College Associate Degree in Business with a Major in Accounting , and the

Bachelor of Science Degree with a Major in Business Administration

The purpose of this agreement is to outline the provisions governing the articulation of the Associate Degree in Business with a Major in Accounting at Florence-Darlington Technical College and the Bachelor of Science Degree with a Major in Business Administration at Morris College.

Graduates of the Associate Degree in Business Program with a Major in Accounting at Florence-Darlington Technical College with a grade of "C" or higher on all courses will receive credit toward the Bachelor of Science Degree with a Major in Business Administration at Morris College as outlined Attachment 1. Course articulation is aligned with the South Carolina Commission on Higher Education Statewide Articulation Agreement between Technical College Courses and Public Senior Institutions, Morris College Transfer Guidelines, and detailed review of course syllabi. Courses not addressed in Attachment 1 will be reviewed on an individual basis, with Morris College being the final authority as to transferability.

This agreement becomes effective with the beginning of the major academic term immediately following the date of final signature and will be reviewed every two years or whenever either institution makes a change in either of the articulated programs.
