All five (5) of the *required ADJ support courses* may be transferred to SRU if appropriate courses have been completed at BCC.

## AGREEMENT FOR ARTICULATION OF ACADEMIC PROGRAMS Between Bristol Community College and Salve Regina University

#### CRIMINAL JUSTICE / ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE

The above institutions hereby enter into an agreement to facilitate the transfer of students enrolled in the Associate of Science in **Criminal Justice** degree program at Bristol Community College into the **Administration of Justice** program at Salve Regina University.

Salve Regina University will accept into its baccalaureate program sixty to sixty-two credits earned in Bristol Community College's program leading to the Associate of Science in Criminal Justice degree. Students will receive transfer credit for courses required in the Salve Regina University program leading to a Baccalaureate Degree in Administration of Justice if they have been completed at Bristol Community College with a grade of C or better. If any related changes occur within either curriculum, the schools will agree to review such changes to determine transferability of credit.

This Program Agreement is tied to the Transfer Agreement between Salve Regina University and Bristol Community College. Students must meet the minimum grade point average, degree guidelines, and all other requirements of the Transfer Agreement. Students not participating in the Criminal Justice/ADJ Program Agreement may enroll at Salve Regina via standard admission protocol and will receive an evaluation of credit based on current course equivalencies.

Students who wish to enroll in the Administration of Justice program at Salve Regina should follow Bristol Community College's Criminal Justice curriculum. To help fulfill requirements at Salve Regina, Bristol Community College students should consider the guidelines of this Program Agreement. The number of credits needed to complete the Baccalaureate Degree will be determined based on the nature of courses transferred. A minimum of 36 credits must be completed at Salve Regina as the residency requirement.

All students who wish to and are qualified to transfer will be required to file an application with the Office of Admissions of Salve Regina University. As a part of the admission process, accepted students will receive a list of those courses for which the student has received credit. Students should refer to the Salve Regina University and Bristol Community College Undergraduate Catalogs for detailed information regarding curriculum requirements, university policy, and transfer admission procedures.

### **TRANSFER AGREEMENT**

#### Between Bristol Community College and Salve Regina University

Salve Regina University assures the acceptance of any associate degree graduate who meets our acceptance criteria and has earned a cumulative grade point average of 2.7 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) into the University. This agreement does not guarantee admission into the University's professional programs which may have enrollment limits or additional clinical/field placement sequencing requirements.

Transfer students will receive academic credit for all college-level courses applied toward the requirements of the associate degree in which the student has earned a grade of C or better. Non-credit, non-academic, or remedial courses adjudged to be below college level will not be accepted for transfer.

It is understood that if a student does not have the foundation or skill to enroll in an upper level course at Salve Regina University, he/she will be required to take any necessary prerequisite(s). Therefore, Salve Regina University cannot assure that every student can complete the requirements for the baccalaureate degree in two years.

The Salve Regina University catalog provides detailed information on degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their associate degree programs to ensure meeting prerequisites for upper division courses are encouraged to communicate early with the appropriate department chairperson at Salve Regina University.

The primary contact for the colleges will be the chief academic officer at each institution. The agreement will be reviewed bi-annually and may be revised by mutual consent. Termination of this agreement by either party requires no less than one year's notice. This agreement replaces previous articulation agreements designed for this purpose between Salve Regina University and Bristol Community College.
