FINE ARTS Four semester credits from Art, Drama, Fine Arts or Music. One course chosen must emphasize the cultural/historical aspects of the art form. Additional course(s) must be participatory or performance oriented. Warner Pacific College accepts the Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer degree in direct substitution for core requirements provided courses equal at least 2 semester credits (3 quarter credits) each and are numbered 100-level or higher. Two Humanities and one Religion course must be taken at Warner Pacific.

NOTES:

1. If planning to enroll fall semester, apply early in the academic year. For spring semester enrollment, send application at least 2 months prior to the start of term.
2. Only courses numbered 100 or higher are accepted.
3. A maximum 108 quarter credits may be transferred.
4. Transfer students enrolling with fewer than 20 semester credits (30 quarter credits) must provide high school transcripts and SAT/ACT scores.
5. In conversion from quarter to semester credits, the number of quarter credits earned is multiplied by .67 (EXAMPLE: 30 qtr cr x .67 = 20.1 semester cr.).
6. No professional/technical "applied science" courses, "special project" courses, or "cooperative work experience" courses will be accepted for core requirements.
7. Unofficial transcript evaluations are available anytime. Call 1-503-517-1020 or 1-800-804-1510.
8. To enter with sophomore standing, a minimum of 30 semester (45 quarter) credits must be transferable; to enter with junior standing, a minimum of 60 semester (90 quarter) credits must be transferable.
10. Courses in the major may duplicate courses in the core curriculum.
