**Articulation Agreement
For Transfer Credit
2001-2002**

Agreement made this 8th day of August, 2001 between Newbury College and Bristol Community College.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to approve the mechanics by which transfer credit is awarded to students who successfully meet the articulation criteria. Articulation is defined as an agreement by Newbury College and Bristol Community College that common educational objectives, content, and student competencies exist in programs in specific disciplines common to both institutions. Based on the identification of common course content and competencies, an appropriate arrangement can be made to award transfer credit for those courses for which the student has achieved the competencies required in corresponding Newbury College courses.

CONDITIONS FOR ARTICULATION

The following conditions of articulation are hereby set forth:

1. The student must meet all Newbury College admission requirements for transfer students and be a matriculated student in good standing to be eligible for credit via articulation.
2. The Office of Admission will be responsible for evaluating the official college transcript and recommending a transfer credit based on the stated conditions in the applicable articulation agreement.
3. The student must meet all conditions for articulation stated in the Articulation Agreement, which covers the requested courses.
4. This agreement may be terminated in whole or in part by either party giving a full (30) days notice in writing to the party. However, such termination shall not take effect with regard to students already enrolled.
5. Substitutions for courses listed may be evaluated for transfer credit on a case-by-case basis.
