Limestone College and Spartanburg Community College

Transfer Agreement

Limestone College and Spartanburg Community College agree to the following policy for transfer of graduates of Associate Degrees in college parallel or transfer programs. This agreement shall begin during the current academic year and will continue until such time as it is modified by mutual consent or cancelled by either college.

- 1. Coursework covered within this agreement shall be transferable if the student has completed the coursework with a grade of "C" (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) or above, but the transferability of courses with grades of "C" or above does not relieve the student of the obligation to meet the 2.0 GPA requirement or the other admissions requirements of Limestone College.
- 2. Spartanburg Community College Associate Degree graduates in a transfer or college parallel program are eligible for transfer to Limestone College. Limestone College will accept up to 66 semester hours for graduates of the following programs:
 - a. Associate of Arts
 - b. Associate of Science
- 3. Graduates with an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science degree from Spartanburg Community College will have satisfied all General Education requirements at Limestone College. All other courses accepted for transfer will be based on the Statewide Articulation Agreement - Appendix A and on the SCC/LC Articulation List - Appendix B.
- 4. Limestone College will accept Spartanburg Community College courses as noted in Appendix C to satisfy Limestone College degree requirements for the following degree plans:
 - Bachelor of Science Business Administration/ Accounting
 - b. Bachelor of Science Business Administration/ Management
 - c. Bachelor of Science Business Administration/ Marketing
 - d. Bachelor of Arts Flementary Education (Gaffney site only)
 - e. Bachelor of Social Work Social Work
 - f. Bachelor of Science Liberal Studies
- 5. Limestone College will accept a maximum of 66 semester hours' credit from Spartanburg Community College whether or not an Associate's Degree has been earned.
- 6. Courses not covered by paragraphs 2 through 4 above shall be evaluated on an individual basis.

 Students must complete at Limestone College a minimum of 31 semester hours, including 15 semester hours in the major, to earn the baccalaureate degree.

Spartanburg Community College agrees to publish information about this agreement in printed materials and on the institution's Internet website.
