



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE (BCCC) &
UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND BALTIMORE COUNTY (UMBC)


The EHS program at UMBC agrees to recognize the integrity of the EMS Program AA Degree from BCCC and place transferring students from BCCC into the first semester, Junior year, of the EHS Management Track.


In order for this to occur, the following conditions apply to the transferring student:


1. The student will not display on their BCCC transcript any course grade lower than a "C" for any BCCC EMS AA Degree program course. If a grade for a program course is lower than a "C", the student must, at the discretion of advising faculty at UMBC, take the course work again until a "C" or higher is obtained. Up to 31 of the BCCC EMS program courses credits will be transferred to UMBC as Paramedic training. Up to a total of 60 credits from the BCCC EMS Program AA degree will transfer to UMBC.
2. The student is a current National Registry Emergency Medical Technician - Paramedic (NREMT-P) with a valid EMT-P certification card.
3. The student has completed and/or meets all requirements for admission into UMBC.


This agreement may be cancelled at any time by either party with thirty days written notice.
