Sign Language Interpreter B. S. Completion Program Cincinnati State Technical and Community College to Wright State University

Students who complete the Interpreter Training Program at Cincinnati State Technical and Community College may use all, or almost all, of their credits toward the Bachelor of Science degree in Sign Language Interpreting at Wright State.

What is the Sign Language Interpreter (SLI) Program?

The Sign Language Interpreter (SLI) Program is a B.S. degree completion program that provides advanced education and training to students with an associate degree in sign language interpreting. The major provides specific coursework to improve skills in sign language interpreting as well as the opportunity to pursue individual projects benefiting the interpreting community. In addition, this program was designed to meet impending Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (RID) education degree requirements for certification in sign language interpreting.

Why complete a B.S. in Sign Language Interpreting?

The Registry of Interpreters (RID) has mandated that sign language interpreters must have a bachelor's degree by 2012 to be considered for certification. Wright State University has partnered with Cincinnati State Technical and Community College and other Ohio community colleges to develop this completion program to provide graduates of associate degree programs with further academic training to meet those requirements.

Admission Requirements to this major at Wright State:

Completion of the Associate of Applied Science in Interpreter Training degree at Cincinnati State Technical and Community College with a GPA of at least 2.35 and an onsite interview.

Cincinnati State students may take additional courses beyond their associate degree in order to meet requirements for the Sign Language Interpreter degree. Students may complete the Ohio Transfer Module before transferring to fulfill WSU's General Education (GE) requirements or transfer individual GE courses. Consult a Cincinnati State or Wright State advisor for more information about transferring courses.

NOTE: Students must complete a minimum of 45 hours at Wright State to meet the residency requirement.
