For humanities elective options at Bucks, Drexel recommends equivalent courses in communications, english, music, sociology, psychology, fine arts, foreign languages, philosophy, history, political science, and anthropology.

To fulfill Drexel's BHC program math requirement of 6 semester credits (9 quarter credits), choose any 2 college-level math courses.

To fulfill Drexel's BHC science requirement of 6 semester credits (9 quarter credits), choose any 2 college-level courses from the following: biology, chemistry, anatomy, or physiology.

For students enrolling in the Behavioral Health Counseling program at Drexel, a maximum of 90 semester credits will transfer. Credits earned beyond the Soc. Sciences/Humanities and Free Electives will be considered as BACS Program Electives.

To receive transfer credit, the courses must be substantially equivalent to courses offered in the desired curriculum at Drexel and you must have completed the courses with a grade of C (C=2.0) or better. The transfer courses listed should be used as a general guide and might not be acceptable for every major at the University. We make every effort to keep this guide current but cannot guarantee that every course will be acceptable for transfer. The number of credits you can transfer will be determined by the academic department once you've been accepted.
