Lab Science (4): BIOL 109 & 110, and CHEM 110 & 118 (or CHEM 121 & 122)

Math (2): MATH 118 and MATH 251 (or ECON 112)
Social Science (3): PSYC 101, PSYC 215, and SOC 101
Humanities (2): PHIL 211 and any humanities elective.
Technology (1): Any, could count as a free elective at Drexel

General (4): BIO 241, DIET 111, any social science elective not listed above, any general elective

To receive transfer credit, the courses must be substantially equivalent to courses offered in the desired curriculum at Drexel and you must have completed the courses with a grade of C (C=2.0) or better. The transfer courses listed should be used as a general guide and might not be acceptable for every major at the University. be acceptable for transfer. The number of credits you can transfer will be determined by the academic department once you've been accepted.
