**The remainder of the CCRI free elective credits will be applied to the free electives component of the Providence College SCE bachelor's degree programs listed in this agreement. Fifty-four (54) free elective credits are permitted in the B.A. Liberal Studies program.

NOTES: CCRI students who complete the General Studies associate's degree with at least 60 credits and a minimum GPA of 2.0 will be guaranteed admission into the Providence College SCE bachelor's program in Liberal Studies. Students must earn a grade of "C" or better to earn transfer credit for a course.

1. Providence College will waive the \$55 application fee for students who meet the above requirements.
2. Students must fulfill the Providence College SCE's core curriculum requirements; complete the residency requirement of a minimum of 39 credits in Providence College SCE; and earn at least 50% of their major credits with Providence College SCE coursework.
3. Most students transferring in with the Associate's in General Studies will need approximately 54 credits to complete the bachelor's degree.

English courses: Most **CCRI** English courses designated as Writing will transfer to PC SCE as Writing, and those designated as Literature will transfer as Literature. Some CCRI English courses may fulfill either category. Additionally, the following courses will transfer to PC SCE as Writing courses: ENGL 1090, Paragraph Writing in ESL (3 vs. 6 credits); ENGL 1300, Composition I for Speakers of English as a Second Language (3 vs. 6 credits). **The following courses will transfer as electives and do not fulfill either Writing or Literature requirements:** ENGL 1070, ENGL 1075, ENGL 1080, ENGL 2016. **Courses that do not transfer:** ENGL 0250, 0312, 0700, 0850, 0890, 1000.

Typically, courses from the following CCRI departments are accepted by Providence College SCE: accounting, art, astronomy, biology, business administration, chemistry, Chinese, computer studies and information processing (COMI and COMP), economics, emergency management, English, engineering, fire science, French, geography, geology, German, history, human services, Italian, Japanese, law, mathematics, manufacturing, music, networking certification (CSCO), oceanography, philosophy, physics, political science, Portuguese, psychology, Army ROTC, Russian, sociology, Spanish, speech, and theater. Courses taken in electronics technology, engineering technology, and as part of a health science or administrative science major will be reviewed for credit on a case by case basis by a Providence College SCE adviser.
