Please note that certain programs in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences recommend specific courses to fulfill General Education requirements. Please see an academic advisor at Wayne State University for a complete major plan.

Major Requirements The following courses will transfer to Wayne State University from Lansing Community College and may be used to fulfill the course requirements for either the Bachelor of Science in Psychology or the Bachelor of Arts with a Major in Psychology degree. Please consult an adviser in the Department of Psychology at Wayne State University for a complete major plan.

- **Below are courses that will count towards the Psychology Major. However, selecting all of the psychology courses below may cause you to take more credits than what will transfer for your degree.** Students are strongly encouraged to complete only General Education Requirement courses at Lansing Community College. - The B.S. Degree requires a minimum of twenty-seven credits earned in natural science outside the field of psychology. Please consult an adviser in the Department of Psychology at WSU for a list of applicable science courses.

University General Education requirements must be met in order to earn a degree at Wayne State University, regardless of college or major. Wayne State University's General Education requirements are divided into two categories: Competency Requirements and Group Requirements. Not more than two Group Requirements may be satisfied by courses in the same Wayne State University department.

Credit hours for each course are listed in parentheses following the course number.

Unless otherwise noted, please select one course to fulfill each requirement. If two courses are listed together with a "+" sign, then **both** courses are required to fulfill the single requirement.

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Bilingual students: The Foreign Language group requirement in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences will be considered satisfied for students who were born in and completed their secondary education in a country whose language is not English. However, no credit (through course work or by examination) will be granted for elementary- or intermediate-level courses in that language. Bilingual students who satisfy the Foreign Language Group Requirement in this manner will simultaneously fulfill the University General Education Requirement in Foreign Culture.
