NOTE: Some courses have been approved in more than one category. Each course, however, may fulfill ONLY one requirement. All courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher. Students must apply to be accepted into the UNIC College of Nursing (Traditional Bachelor of Science in Nursing)-regard - Amendator) program. Admission to the programs is highly competitive. Thus the general education courses listed on this site are the non-nursing requirements students must complete before applying to the program. At lease 13 - 14 of the following requirements must be completed before applying: English Composition I, Anatomy (or Anatomy and Physiology I), Physiology II), Introduction to Sociology, Introduction to Psychology, Human Growth and Development, Chemistry with Lab, Statistics, College Algebra, Microbiology with Lab, Nutrition, Ethics, English Composition II, Humanities elective, Culture/Race/Ethnicity/Gender elective, Family and Human Behavior elective, and Political Science/Social Organizations elective.
