Students anticipating transferring to the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's College of Arts and Sciences (BA or BS degree) may use this guide for selecting Metropolitan Community College courses. Check the UNL Bulletin http://builde.unil.edu/undergraduate/) for information about specific curriculum requirements or check the Arts and Sciences Advising Center website (http://acweb.unil.edu/advisinggenter.html). Students interested in transferring to UNL should communicate regularly with a UNL academic adviser to confirm course selections. To facilitate the transfer for credit, all grades should be a "C" or higher. The University of Nebraska - Lincoln applies a maximum of 66 semester hours (90 quarter hours) in transfer from community colleges toward a UNL degree

IMPORTANT CHANGE: Beginning Fall Semester 2012 UNL will apply 60 semester hours or 90 quarter hours from community colleges toward a UNL degree

NOTE: The Bachelor of Science degree requires completion of 60 semester hours of math (calculus and above) and natural and physical sciences.

NOTE TO PRE-HEALTH STUDENTS: Students planning to continue their education to pursue careers in the health sciences should consider taking Analytical Calculus for ACE requirements to ensure the proper math requirement is completed. Pre-health students are encouraged to take English Composition for ACE 1 and College Distribution Requirement A as many health programs require English Composition.

Achievement-Centered Education (ACE) is the UNL general education curriculum. Students must complete at least one 3 hour course to meet the ACE outcome described below. Following is a list of ACE courses recommended for students planning on majoring in this UNL college. The transfer guides vary significantly by UNL college. Thus students considering more than one major should consult the guides for all of the colleges they are considering. Courses may apply to only one ACE outcome. The UNL course numbers are in [] behind the credit hours.

NOTE: The College of Arts & Sciences requires additional general education courses. See Distribution Requirements at the end of the list of UNL Colleges.

ACE 1 (3 semester hours minimum): Write texts, in various forms, with an identified purpose, that respond to specific audience needs, incorporate research or existing knowledge, and use applicable documentation and appropriate conventions of format and structure. An additional course from this list is needed for the college distribution requirements. If your school does not offer courses for the ACE 1 requirement, take the requirement at UNL.

ACE 2 (3 semester hours minimum): Demonstrate communication competence in one or more of the following ways: (a) by making oral presentations with supporting materials, (b) by leading and participating in problem-solving teams, (c) by employing a repertoire of communication skills for developing and maintaining professional and personal relationships, or (d) by creating and interpreting visual information. If your school does not offer courses for the ACE 2 quirement, take the requirement at UNL.

Bachelor of Science students must complete the Scientific Base which is 60 semester hours of science and math (the equivalent of UNL's Calculus or higher) including one hour of lab. determine the most appropriate courses to meet the science requirement. If your school does not offer courses for the ACE 3 requirement, take the requirement at UNL

Note that only one of CHEM 105-Chemistry in Context I and CHEM 109-General Chemistry I equivalent will apply toward a UNL degree. Note: Bachelor of Science students must complete the Scientific Base which is 60 senseter hours of science and math (the equivalent of UNL's Calculus or higher) including one hour of lab. See additional notes about the math and science requirements in this document. If your school does not offer courses for the ACE 4 requirement, take the requirement at UNL.

Bachelor of Arts students must complete 7 semester hours of math and science (beyond the minimum 3 semester hour ACE 3 and 3 semester hour ACE 4 requirement), including at least 1 lab science course. Bachelor of Science students must complete the Scientific Base which is 60 semester hours of science and math (the equivalent of UNL's Calculus or higher) including one hour of lab. Science courses should be selected from 2 different departments from the disciplines of: Biochemistry, Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Computer Science and Engineering, Geosciences, Physics and Astronomy (see the ACE 4 list in this document).

If your school does not offer courses for this requirement, take the requirement at UNL. ADVISER NOTES: Bachelor of Science students who cannot complete their beginning major courses on your campus may have sequencing issues once they transfer if they complete all of their general education requirements prior to transferring to UNL.
