Students anticipating transferring to UNL's Hixson-Lied College of Fine and Performing Arts may use this guide for selecting Western Nebraska Community College courses. Check the UNL Bulletin (http://www.unl.edu/unlpub/undergrad/index.shtml) for information about specific curriculum requirements or visit the website at FINE AND PERFORMING ARTS (http://www.unl.edu/finearts/). The Hixson-Lied College of Fine and Performing Arts offers a variety of degree programs. Students are strongly encouraged to investigate the different degrees within each major and consult a UNL adviser if more information is necessary.

NOTE: Many community colleges do not offer major courses that are needed for degrees in Fine and Performing Arts. Thus it is in the student's best interest to transfer to UNL as soon as possible to avoid course sequencing delays. This guide incorporates the degree requirements as stated in the University Bulletin. Degree requirements may change each academic year. Students interested in transferring to UNL should communicate regularly with a UNL academic adviser to confirm course selections. Call the Hixson-Lied College of Fine and Performing Arts (402-472-9339) to ask for a referral to an appropriate major adviser. To facilitate the transfer of credit, all grades should be a "C" or higher. The University of Nebraska - Lincoln applies a maximum of 66 semester hours (99 guarter hours) in transfer from community colleges toward a UNL degree.

IMPORTANT CHANGE: Beginning Fall Semester 2012 UNL will apply 60 semester hours or 90 quarter hours from community colleges toward a UNL degree.

Majors and minors (other than art history and studio art) offered by the Hixson-Lied College of Fine and Performing Arts require application and/or audition for admission. See the college's website for details. A cumulative 2.50 GPA is required for all programs except the Film and New Media program (offered by the Johnny Carson School of Theatre and Film) which requires a minimum 3.0 cumulative

Achievement-Centered Education (ACE) is the UNL general education curriculum. Students must complete at least one 3 hour course to meet the ACE outcome described below. A course may only apply to one outcome. Following is a list of ACE courses recommended for students planning on majoring in this UNL college. The transfer guides vary significantly by UNL college. Thus students considering more than one major should consult the guides for all of the colleges they are considering. The UNL course numbers are in [] behind the credit hours:

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: 0-16 semester hours. The actual number of hours needed depends upon the student's language background. For example, students who successfully completed 4 years of foreign language of the same language in high school do not need any college foreign language (0 hours). Students pursuing the Bachelor of Music or the Bachelor of Arts degree must complete through the UNL 202 or 210 level (fourth level) of a single foreign language either while they were in high school or by completing college credits. Students who successfully completed 4 years of foreign language of the same language in high school do not need any college foreign language (0 hours). Students who completed less than 4 years in high school may start at any level in the 4 semester sequence but MUST complete the 202 (or the equivalent of the 4th level) of a language to complete the requirement. Students pursuing the Bachelor of Music Education or the Bachelor of Fine Arts degree who completed two years of foreign language in high school do not need any college foreign language; those students who completed less than two years in the same language who are pursuing one of these two degrees must complete the 102 level (ore the equivalent) in college.
