## Transfer Guide for a Bachelor of Arts in Communication

### Bachelor of Arts in Communication

The communication department has a selective admission policy. Student interest in the department has increased steadily over the past several years. To best serve the students in the program, it is necessary to limit the number of majors in the program.

- You may apply for admission during the semester in which you will complete 45 hours of coursework.
- You must have a GPA competitive with other applicants in the semester that you apply. Although a GPA of 2.5 does NOT guarantee admission, it is the lowest ever considered. *Your GPA is computed only on the basis of coursework completed in the University of Missouri system as adjusted by the MU grade repeat policy.* It is listed as the CUM GPA on the transcript. Transfer grades are not used to calculate the GPA for admission to the Communication Department. (revised 2/11/2002)
- You must have taken and completed one Communication course at the University of Missouri in Columbia with a grade of **B-** or better. Comm 1200, Comm 2100, or Comm 3050 are suggested.
- You must have a competitive grade point average in Communication courses completed at MU.
- You must have completed Math 1100 and English 1000.
- Transfer students must complete one semester of coursework at MU (at least 12 hours).

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<b>Distribution of Content</b>					<b>35-36 hours</b>
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- **Biological Science, Physical Science, and/or Mathematical Science (9 hours)**

- One lab science
- Courses from two different areas of science (biological, physical, or math)

- **Behavioral Science (5-6 hours)**

- **Social Science (9 hours)**

- Courses from at least two subjects

- **Humanities and/or Fine Arts (12 hours)**

- Courses from at least three different subjects

- The coursework must include at least three courses numbered 2000 or higher distributed in at least two of the four areas of distribution

- A 2000-level course at ECC is considered a 2000-level course at MU. The level is based on the course number at ECC, not the MU equivalent course number

- One 2000-level course must be taken at MU

- Only A&S courses will count toward the 2000 level or higher course requirement

- Only one non-A&S course may be counted in each of the four areas

- Courses in the major may not be used to fulfill A&S Foundation requirements

NOTE: Some ECC courses are not directly equivalent to MU courses but will transfer to MU into the category indicated (HUM-humanity, SSC-social science, LIT-literature-humanity, BEH-behavioral science, BIO-biological science, BIOL-biological science with lab, MTH-math science, PSC-physical science, and PSCL-physical science with lab.
