

MACC to MU Transfer Agreement for Psychology

A maximum of 66 credit hours will be accepted by MU from MACC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology. Students must complete 30 of the last 36 hours in residence at MU, enrolled in MU courses approved for the BA in Psychology program.

Transfer students from MCC who have completed the Associate of Arts with an emphasis in Psychology, upon acceptance into the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology program, will have junior standing at MU.

SECTION III: PROGRAM PLAN

Students falling under this program articulation agreement will be responsible for successful completion of their Associate of Arts degree, including the completion of an emphasis area in Psychology as follows:

Associate of Arts – Psychology Emphasis Requirements 12-15 credits

Before transfer MACC students will complete 12-15 hours in Psychology as follows:

- PSY 101: General Psychology (3) required
- MTH 120: Elementary Statistics (3) required
- 9-12 additional hours in PSY from the following list:
PSY201, PSY205, PSY210

Students that enter MACC with advanced standing in a foreign language, or that test into advanced semesters of a foreign language sequence at MACC, are encouraged to complete the foreign language sequence at MACC in lieu of third humanities elective or last psychology elective courses. Otherwise, the 12-13 hour foreign language requirement must be completed after transfer at MU in the 3rd and 4th years.

Remaining Arts and Science Foundation Requirements: Completed at MU

Bachelor of Arts in Psychology at MU – Years 3 and 4

In addition to courses taken at MACC, students will take courses to complete the 15-hour distribution requirement in Psychology. The psychology major at MU also includes a required two-semester research methods sequence (3010 & 3020). Concurrently with 3010, students will enroll in STAT 1300 (unless previously completed) which will fulfill both their statistics requirement and their math reasoning proficiency requirement. Following completion of 3020 students will enroll in a 3-hour capstone course. This course is typically taken in a student's final semester.

Students must complete a total of 120 hours in order to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from the MU College of Arts & Science. It will take approximately 51-64 credit hours beyond the credits from the Associate of Arts degree at MACC to fulfill the requirements specific to the Bachelor of Arts degree at MU. Elective courses may be used, if necessary, to bring the total credit hours at MACC and MU to 120.

Additional Courses to Complete Graduation, MU General Education, and Arts & Science Foundation Requirements for a Bachelor of Arts in Psychological Sciences at MU:

WRITING INTENSIVE COURSES

Complete one Writing Intensive (WI) course with a grade of C- or better. The WI course must be numbered 3000 or higher and must be a science or math course. WI courses may be used to fulfill other graduation requirements and thus do not necessarily add to the total hours required.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE (Unless completed at MACC)

Complete either three semesters of a single foreign language (I, II and III = 13 credit hours) or the equivalent. Select languages may require only two semesters (I and II = 12 credit hours). This requirement is waived if four units of a single foreign language were completed in high school. International students from non-English speaking countries do not need to take additional foreign language courses.

Minimum number of credits required for baccalaureate degree: 120 credits
