### Articulation Agreement

Eastern Oregon University's Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts in psychology provides specialized study in psychology within the context of the broader goals of a liberal arts education. The psychology program promotes an understanding of behavior, provides an understanding of the foundations of psychology as a scientific discipline, integrates the influence of psychology on contemporary thought, and promotes skills in scientific research. An undergraduate degree in psychology prepares students for entry into graduate and professional schools and prepares students for entry-level positions in the helping professions. This degree program is offered on the Eastern Campus, and Online.

Students who incorporate the above three UCC Psychology courses in to their Associate of Arts/Oregon Transfer Degree from Umpqua Community College will be in position to move smoothly in to Eastern Oregon University's Psychology Major. This UCC degree meets requirements set jointly by Oregon's community colleges and the Oregon University System. A cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher is required. All Foundational Requirements and Discipline Studies Requirements courses must be at least three credits each.

This degree provides for "block transfer" to Eastern Oregon University. All lower division general education requirements of EOU are met.

To earn an EOU baccalaureate degree, students must complete the University graduation requirements and the program requirements as outlined for each specific major.

#### EOU General University Graduation Requirements

- 180 -- minimum credits required to graduate from EOU
- 60 -- minimum credits of upper division (300 & 400 level) credits required to graduate from EOU
- 60 -- General Education Core credits required to graduate from EOU
- 45 -- minimum credits must be earned from EOU
- 120 - maximum credits that can be transferred to EOU from accredited institutions
- 12 -- maximum vocational/technical elective credits can be transferred
- "C-"-- the minimum grade required in courses used to satisfy both Program and General Education requirements
- Math - Students must complete a college level math course. *(See EOU catalog for details.)*

- Writing -- Students must complete the University Writing Requirements. (See EOU catalog)
- Language - two years of college level foreign language or its equivalent required for a BA degree

### GENERAL EDUCATION CORE CLASSES

Transfer students who have not completed the AAOT degree may use the UCC General Education classes listed below toward fulfillment of the EOU 60 credit requirement. Students should consult an advisor to make sure they are not exceeding the maximum lower division course work. Some program requirement classes may also count toward the General Education Core requirements. In order to prepare for EOU's Psychology Major Psy 201,202 & 203 may be completed at UCC.

*(The Gen Ed Core classes will count toward EOU's General Education Core requirements for non-ASOT graduates, but may not for UCC degrees.)*
