This agreement is based on the evaluation of the rigor and content of COCC's coursework and OSU's Baccalaureate Core and major/option requirements of the B.S. degree in Human Development and Family Sciences: Gerontology Option.

Note: Students may only transfer 124 lower-division credits towards an Oregon State University Baccalaureate degree. This agreement is subject to yearly re-evaluation by both schools for continuance. Changes to degree requirements or courses at either institution will necessitate an addendum that will be attached to this articulation agreement.
