Effective: From Spring Term 2007 through Spring Term 2008

B.A., B.S. in Art; Fine Arts Option

It is agreed that students transferring from Central Oregon Community College having completed their Associate of Science - Direct Transfer (AS-DT) degree in the major listed above and having completed the courses listed in the attached articulation agreement will be granted junior status at Oregon State University's Cascades Campus. All of the lower division Baccalaureate Core, College of Liberal Arts Core, and most of the major/option course requirements will be considered as having been fulfilled. This agreement is based on the evaluation of the rigor and content of COCC's coursework and OSU's Baccalaureate Core, College of Liberal Arts Core, and the major/option requirements.

Note: Students may only transfer 124 lower-division credits towards an Oregon State University Baccalaureate degree. This agreement is subject to yearly re-evaluation by both schools for continuance. Changes to degree requirements or courses at either institution will necessitate an addendum that will be attached to this articulation agreement.

Additional Requirements:

All students wishing to pursue a B.A. or B.S. in Art (Fine Arts Option) are required to submit a portfolio of work for admission consideration into the baccalaureate degree program.

Electives and Additional Comments:

- This direct transfer agreement requires a minimum of 106 credit hours. The lower division courses required for the B.A., B.S. in Art: Fine Arts Option are listed above. Students who are accepted into the Art major will have met all of the lower division Baccalaureate Core and Liberal Arts Core requirements.
- No additional courses/electives are required for the AS-DT degree. However, additional lower-division courses will be required to meet the requirements for either the B.A. or B.S. degree.
- Upon transfer to OSU, the student will have junior standing.
- Note: No more than 12 professional-technical credits may be used.
- B.A. Versus B.S. Degree:
 - Students interested in pursuing a **Bachelor of Arts degree**, will be required to take two years of a foreign language (or receive a grade of C- or better in the 203-level course). Foreign language credits will count as elective coursework for this degree.
[Note: Due to the large number of lower division credit hours required for the Art degree, some lower division credit hours taken to meet the B.A. degree requirement may not transfer. Students need to work with their advisor to assess which courses will transfer from COCC to OSU Cascades.]
 - Students interested in pursuing a **Bachelor of Science degree** must take the following courses; 15 credit hours of science, computer science, and quantitative studies.
 1. Computer Science course; 3-4 credits.
 2. Any additional course in the natural or physical sciences; 3-4 credits.
 3. Choose one of the following (8-12):
 - a. Any 8 credits of approved ST courses, 4 credits of which must be at or above the 300-level;
 - b. MTH 111* (4) and MTH 245 (4); COCC's MTH 111 and MTH 243. Note: If MTH 111 is used towards the general education math requirement, credits cannot be counted in the electives area;
 - c. Any 8 credits of 200-level math courses (excluding COCC's MTH 211, MTH 212, MTH 213); or
 - d. MTH 241 and MTH 251.
