No portfolio is required for admission to Visual Art. However, a portfolio review is required for an annual incoming freshman scholarship competition.

All entering freshmen in Art and Design are required to participate in a foundation curriculum offered through the Foundations program before enrolling in advanced art or design studio courses. Freshmen complete Introduction to Drawing I and II, Introduction to Design I and II before enrolling in advanced art or design studio courses. Freshmen typically enroll in these classes along with English, two semesters of Art History, and other Liberal Arts Electives.
