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**ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:** A total of 62 semester hours of credit in an accredited liberal arts college with a minimum GPA of 2.5 is required in order to apply to the School of Nursing. Admission is competitive, so it is highly recommended that each student apply to more than one school of nursing. Each student must meet the freshman-sophomore requirements of the particular college he or she attended in order to insure the attainment of general education electives.

**APPLICATION DEADLINE:** Only one class is admitted each year. To have an application considered it must be completed and in the Office of Student Affairs by October 15<sup>th</sup> of the year preceding entry into the School of Nursing. For example, to be considered for class beginning August 2010, the application must be submitted by October 15, 2009. If spaces are available after all initial applicants have been reviewed, we may accept contingency applications.

Electives can be chosen according to the student's particular interest or needs. Examples of such elective areas of study are foreign language, philosophy, literature, creative writing, history, speech, physics, mathematics, political science, biological sciences, and economics.

A maximum of 8 non-liberal arts credits will be accepted in the 62 hours required for admission. These 8 credits may be courses in physical education, activity, first-aid, health education, technique courses in art, music, and professional fields other than nursing. Courses with grades of "D" or "F" will not be counted towards the required 62 hours.

NOTE: Pass/Fail Policy. No Pass/Fail courses will be accepted.

The requirements listed above are subject to annual change.
