To transfer to the Graziadio School of Business and Management's Bachelor of Science in Management program, a student must have earned an acceptable grade point average on 68 or more transferable semester units from a regionally accredited college or university. Students should have prior or current work experience in order to relate to the other students and the material covered in the courses. Final decision of transferable courses will be made by Program Office representatives at the Graziadio School of Business and Management.

Pepperdine will determine if transferrable courses fall under General Education or Elective Categories.

Area 1: English Composition

English Composition (1 course-3 units) *Must be completed with a grade of "C" or better prior to application for admission to the BSM Program.*

Acceptable categories for transferrable courses include: Freshman English or Composition, College Composition, English Rhetoric, Composition and Literature, Expository Writing, English Expression. Unacceptable courses: Basic Grammar, English as a Second Language, Business English, English Fundamentals.

Acceptable CLEP tests: Freshman College Composition, English Composition with Essay.

Area 2: Mathematics

Mathematics (1 course-3 units) *Must be completed with a grade of "C" or better prior to application for admission to the BSM Program.*

Acceptable categories for transferrable courses include: College Algebra, Trigonometry, Calculus, Geometry, and Statistics.

Acceptable CLEP tests: Calculus with Elementary Functions, College Algebra, College Algebra - Trigonometry, Trigonometry.

Acceptable DANTES tests: Fundamentals of College Algebra, Principles of Statistics.

Area 3 : Humanities and Arts

Humanities and Fine Arts (3 courses-9 units)

Acceptable categories for transferrable courses include: Art, Drama, English, History, Literature, Music, Philosophy, Religion, Speech, Stage Management, Communication, Photography, Journalism, Foreign Language, and Theater Arts.

Acceptable CLEP tests: Western Civilization I, Western Civilization II, American Literature, English Literature, Analyzing and Interpreting Literature, College Level French Language, College Level German Language, College Level Spanish Language, History of the U.S. I, History of the U.S. II.

Acceptable DANTES tests: Art of the Western World, Ethics in America or (SF 474 Ethics in America Essay), Introduction to World Religions, Principles of Public Speaking.

Area 4: Social and Behavioral Science

Social Science (4 courses-12 units)

One course for 3 semester units **MUST** be in (US History or American Government)

**The courses italicized below on page 3 meet the US History or American Government requirement.*

Acceptable categories for transferrable courses include: Cultural Anthropology, Psychology, History, Political Science, Cultural Geography, Archaeology, Economics, American Institutions, Sociology, Health Education.

Acceptable CLEP tests: American Government, Introductory Sociology, Western Civilization I, Western Civilization II, Introductory Psychology, Principles of Macro Economics, Principles of Micro Economics, Human, Growth and Development, History of the U.S. I, History of the U.S. II.

Acceptable DANTES tests: Contemporary Western Europe: 1946-1990, An Introduction to the Modern Middle East, Human/Cultural Geography, Rise and Fall of the Soviet Union, A History of the Vietnam War, The Civil War and Reconstruction, Lifespan Developmental Psychology, General Anthropology.

In addition, the following courses have been articulated so as to provide an option for student to **WAIVE UP TO 12 UNITS OF BSM COURSE WORK**, thus reducing the residential units to be taken at Pepperdine to 48 units. A minimum of four additional elective units are required for each four-unit course waived.

- Grade B or better in **ECO 221 (3) and ECO 222 (3)** to waive ECNM 469 Managerial Economics (4)
- Grade of B or better in **MAT 273 (3) and CIS 355 (3)** to waive DESC 471 Statistical Methods for Business (4)

Note that students who waive any of the above courses in the BSM program and who subsequently enroll in the MBAJ program will be required to complete the equivalent MBA core course

Additional Transfer Information:

In addition to courses taken in any of the subject areas listed previously, Pepperdine's Graziadio School of Business and Management may accept credit in the following areas:

CLEP or DANTES Examinations:

The Graziadio School may **accept a maximum of 32 units from CLEP/DANTES tests**. Each acceptable subject examination **with a score of 50 or higher may earn 4 units of credit**. Note that each subject foreign language exam may earn up to 8 units. Up to 16 units may be used to meet general education requirements, provided the tests were subject examinations. *No duplicate credit is given for CLEP or DANTES tests and course covering the same content.

Extension Courses:

A Pepperdine preadmission advisor will provide an unofficial evaluation of extension coursework.

Assessment of Prior Learning (APL):

A maximum of 30 semester units from a regionally accredited college may be submitted for elective unit transfer.

Online Courses:

Semester units may be submitted for transfer from a regionally accredited college.

Military Experience:

The following may be given as lower-division elective credit when the proper form is submitted:

- Enlisted6 units
- Warrant Officer.....9 units
- Commissioned Officer..... 12 units

Credit may be given in no more than one of the above categories. Veterans are required to submit Form DD214, and active-duty military personnel must submit Form DD295.

Military Service Schools:

Credit may be granted for military schools and courses recommended for credit by the American Council on Education. Courses must be equivalent to Pepperdine University program offerings. Credit may be given when Form DD295 or Form DD214 is submitted.

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
