To transfer to the Graziadio School of Business and Management's Bachelor of Science in Management program, a student must have earned an acceptable grade point average on 68 or more transferable semester units from a regionally accredited college or university. Students should be employed on a full-time basis or have significant prior work experience in order to relate to the other students and the material covered in the course. Final decision of transferable courses will be made by admission representatives at the Graziadio School of Business and Management, Pepperdine University.

All courses listed in the Associate Degree Graduation Requirements under Area A: Natural Sciences **OR** Area B1: Physical Science or B2: Life Science for CSU Breadth **OR** Area 5: Physical and Biological Sciences for IGETC.

AREA 6: LIFELONG LEARNING AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Additional 15 GE units to satisfy the minimum 45 units GE requirement may be drawn from any of the above subject areas PLUS those courses listed under:

Area E2: Health and Physical Education (4 units maximum) plus Health 11for Associate Degree Graduation Requirements **OR**

Area B4: Scientific Inquiry and Quantitative Reasoning **and** Area E: Life-Long Understanding and Self-Development (four-unit limit on activity courses) for CSU Breadth **OR**

Area 2: Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning for IGETC

AREA 7: ELECTIVES

An additional 23-35 semester units of course work from Areas 1 to 6 above <u>PLUS</u> AA/AS major preparation courses. Other courses not listed above that are applicable to the AA degree may be reviewed for applicability as electives. Students are encouraged to take courses from the following areas to enhance their preparation for the Graziadio School's BSM program: ACCOUNTING; BANKING AND FINANCE; BUSINESS; BUSINESS INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY; HOSPITALITY; MARKETING.

In addition, the following courses have been articulated so as to provide an option for students to WAIVE UP TO 12 UNITS OF BSM COURSE WORK, thus reducing the residential units to be taken at Pepperdine to 48 units. A minimum of four additional elective units are required for each four-unit courses waived.

Grade B or better in ACCTG I (5) and ACCTG II (5) to waive ACCT 472 Accounting (4 units). Students
may take ACCTG 21 and ACCTG 22 with grades of B or better in lieu of ACCTG I.
Grade B or better in ECON 1 (3) and ECON 2 (3) to waive ECNM 469 Managerial Economics (4 units.)
Grade B or better in CO SCI 819 (4) and CO SCI 870 (3) to wave ISTM 476 Information Systems for
Business and Management (4 units).
