ARTICULATION AGREEMENT July 2011

Gwynedd-Mercy College B.S. Pre K-4 and Special Education Certification and

Montgomery County Community College A.A. Education in the Early Years: Birth-4th Grade

Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College hereby enter into an agreement governing the matriculation of graduates of the A.A. Education in the Early Years Birth -4th Grade (A.A. Early Years) at Montgomery County Community College into the Bachelor of Science in Pre K-4 and Special Education Certification (B.S. Pre-K-4) at Gwynedd-Mercy College.

According to this agreement with Gwynedd-Mercy College priority in admission is granted to students who graduate from the Associate of Arts Education in the Early Years at Montgomery County Community College:

- 1. The MCCC AA Early Years degree requirements have been completed and conferred with a GPA of 3.00 and all Education courses with grade of C+ or higher. A D grade will be transferred for general education requirements.
- 2. Passage of GMC guidelines for PRAXIS I (Math, Reading, and Writing) exam prior to enrollment at GMC.
- 3. General Education and major Education courses are transferred on a course-by-course basis in accordance with Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) certification requirements and the Dual Admission Agreement Transfer Agreement:
- 4. Minimum of 50 semester credit hours must be completed at GMC, as well as ½ of the GMC Education courses.
- 5. A minimum of 3 GMC SIGNATURE courses must be completed at GMC (these courses are ENG2001, HIS2000, SCI 2000, SOC2000, PHL2000 and RS2000). FYE 1000 and 1001 are waived.
- 6. Student must meet with a MCCC program advisor to discuss the academic program and course sequencing. A full-time student with 3rd year status (Junior) will be able to complete the BS Pre K-4 degree in 4 regular semesters provided that the appropriate AA program requirements at MCCC are followed and appropriately sequencing remaining work at GMC.
- 7. Enroll at GMC within one year of MCCC graduation.

According to this agreement, Montgomery County Community College will:

- 1. Publicize the agreement among its students and faculty.
- 2. Instruct students interested in GMC to complete the DUAL ADMISSIONS Intent form three (3) semesters prior to graduation from MCCC.

According to this agreement, both institutions agree to:

- 1. Monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under the agreement.
- 2. Notify each institution of any contemplated curricular changes which would affect the future of this agreement.

This agreement will be in effect as of Fall 2011 and reviewed annually by the appropriate parties at Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College. This agreement will be renewed automatically until replaced by a new agreement.

Revisions to this agreement may be made with written consent of the representative of Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College. Major changes to this agreement will require signatures from representatives from Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College. Whenever possible, Gwynedd-Mercy College will grandfather students who have followed the previous articulation agreement.

Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice of at least one (1) year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted to Gwynedd-Mercy College under the terms of this agreement, but not yet enrolled in classes.
