## ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

# Gwynedd-Mercy College B.S. in Nursing and Montgomery County Community College A.A.S. in Nursing

Gwynedd-Mercy College (GMC) and Montgomery County Community College (MCCC) hereby enter into an agreement governing the matriculation of graduates of the A.A.S. in Nursing Degree at Montgomery County Community College into the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree at Gwynedd-Mercy College.

According to this agreement with Gwynedd-Mercy College priority in admission is granted to students who graduate from the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing at Montgomery County Community College:

- The MCCC A.A.S. in Nursing degree requirements have been completed and conferred with a GPA of 2.00 with all Nursing Education courses and required sciences and with C and above. A grade of D will be transferred for general education requirements.
- 2. GMC guidelines for admission into the B.S. in Nursing program includes holding a valid Registered Nurse Licensure in the State of Pennsylvania or be RN-eligible. Registered Nurse Licensure must be earned before the spring semester of GMC's junior nursing classes.
- 3. General Education and major courses are transferred on a course-by-course basis in accordance with the Curriculum Transfer Guide.
- 4. Minimum of 45 semester credit hours must be completed at GMC. All 300-400 level Nursing courses are required to be completed through the GMC program.
- 5. A minimum of 3 GMC SIGNATURE courses must be completed at GMC (these courses are ENG2001, HIS2000, SCI 2000, SOC2000, PHL2000 and RS2000). FYE 1000 and 1001 are waived.
- 6. Student must meet with a MCCC Nursing program advisor to discuss the academic program and course sequencing. A full-time student with 3<sup>rd</sup> year status (Junior) will be able to complete the BS in Nursing degree in 4 regular semesters provided that the appropriate BS program requirements at MCCC are followed and remaining work at GMC is appropriately sequenced
- 7. Enroll at GMC within two years of MCCC graduation.

According to this agreement, Montgomery County Community College will:

- 1. Publicize the agreement among its students and faculty.
- 2. Instruct MCCC students interested in GMC to complete the DUAL ADMISSIONS Intent form prior to completing 30 credits towards the MCCC Nursing degree

According to this agreement, both institutions agree to:

- 1. Monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under the agreement.
- 2. Notify each institution of any contemplated curricular changes which would affect the future of this agreement.

This agreement will be in effect as of Fall 2012 and reviewed annually by the appropriate parties at Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College. This agreement will be renewed automatically until replaced by a new agreement

Revisions to this agreement may be made with written consent of the representative of Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College. Major changes to this agreement will require signatures from representatives from Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College. Whenever possible, Gwynedd-Mercy College will grandfather students who have followed the previous articulation agreement.

Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice of at least one (l) year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted to Gwynedd-Mercy College under the terms of this agreement, but not yet enrolled in classes.
