

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
Gwynedd-Mercy College
and
Montgomery County Community College

Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College hereby enter into an agreement governing the matriculation of graduates of the A.A.S. Radiography Program at Montgomery County Community College into the Bachelor of Science in Radiologic Technology Program at Gwynedd-Mercy College.

Priority in admission is granted to students who complete Associate of Applied Science in Radiography Program at Montgomery County Community College and who have passed the registry examination given by the American Registry of Radiologic Technology (ARRT) at the time of admission.

According to this agreement, Gwynedd-Mercy College:

1. Will take 47 transfer credits for the Radiologic Technology courses taken at Montgomery County Community College. An additional 19 credits will be given under the policy for Credit for Life Experience provided the student has passed the registry given by the ARRT. These Life Experience credits must be applied for and paid for in the first semester of study and will be applied to the transcript according to the college policy. It is understood that the Radiologic Technology professional curriculum is standardized and that the courses delivered contain the same content when taught at the AAS level or at the BS level.
2. Will accept general education and science courses on course-by-course bases in accordance with the Dual Admission Agreement/ Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement.
3. Will only accept courses in Natural Science and Radiologic Technology with a grade of C or better.
4. Has a requirement that students must earn 45 credits at Gwynedd-Mercy College.
5. Will have a program advisor discuss the academic plan and course sequence with the student.

According to this agreement, Montgomery County Community College will:

1. Publicize the agreement among its students and faculty.
2. Recommend graduating students who are registry eligible to begin the application process for acceptance into Gwynedd-Mercy College's Bachelor of Science in Radiologic Technology (BSRT) program.

According to this agreement, both institutions agree to:

1. Monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under the agreement.
2. Notify each other concerning any contemplated curricular changes which would affect the future of this agreement.

This agreement is in accordance with the Dual Admission Agreement and Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement between Montgomery County Community College and Gwynedd-Mercy College.


This agreement will be in effect as of July 1, 2009 and reviewed annually by the appropriate parties at Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College. This agreement will be renewed automatically until replaced by a new agreement.


Revisions to this agreement may be made with verbal consent of the representative of Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College. Major changes to this agreement will require signatures from representatives from Gwynedd-Mercy College and Montgomery County Community College. Whenever possible, Gwynedd-Mercy College will grandfather students who have followed the previous articulation agreement.

Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice of at least one (1) year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted to Gwynedd-Mercy College under the terms of this agreement, but not yet enrolled in classes.




