IMPORTANT NOTES

1. A grade of B or better is required in ENG 101 to meet the English composition requirement at Arcadia. Grades below a B will require a placement exam and possible additional course(s) in English.

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2. Students interested in Middle School English should take ENG 212 (EN 229), students interested in Middle School History should take HIS 102 (HS 104), students interested in Middle School Math should take MAT 131 (MA 141) and students interested in Middle School Science should take BIO 151 (BI 101).
3. Students interested in Middle School English should take ENG 221 (EN 320), students interested in Middle School History should take POL 101 (PS 101), students interested in Middle School Math should take MAT 190 (MA 201) and students interested in Middle School Science should take PHY 151 (PH 201).
4. Students interested in Middle School English should take ENG 222 (EN 321), students interested in Middle School History should take ANT 104 (AN 120), students interested in Middle School Math should take MAT 201 (MA 202) and students interested in Middle School Science should take GLG 120 (ES 505).
5. Students interested in Middle School Math should take PHY 151 (PH 201). Students interested in Middle School Science should take AST 120 (PH 224). All others can take any other course that satisfies Core Goal # 8.
6. Students interested in Middle School English should take ENG 202 (EN 322). All others can take any other course that satisfies Core Goal # 7.
7. Students interested in Middle School English should take ENG 115 (EN 215), students interested in Middle School History should take ECO 121 or 122 (EC 210 or 211), students interested in Middle School Mathematics should take MAT 220 (MA 221), students interested in Middle School Science should take CHE 151 (CH 101)
8. Students apply to the School of Education after completion of their first semester at Arcadia. Students are required to have a 3.0 cumulative GPA and passing PAPA scores.
9. Before enrolling at Arcadia, students must have current PA Criminal Background and Child Abuse Clearances and FBI Background Clearance
10. At least 50% of the requirements for the major must be completed at Arcadia University.
11. The maximum number of transfer credits that Arcadia University will accept from MCCC is 75. A minimum grade of "C-" is required to transfer a course to Arcadia.
12. All transfer students to Arcadia University are required to complete the Global Connections Experience and Global Reflection courses. Students must also complete the Senior Capstone Project.
