To fulfill the Behavioral Health Counseling Program's Math Requirement a student must complete one college-level Math course.

To fulfill the Behavioral Health Counseling Program's Natural Life Science Requirement, a student must complete one course from the following: biology, chemistry or anatomy and physiology.

For students enrolling in the Behavioral Health Counseling Program at Drexel, a maximum of 90 semester credits will be considered for transfer. Credits earned beyond the Social Sciences/Humanities and Free Electives requirements may qualify for transfer as course equivalencies.

*To receive transfer credit, the courses must be substantially equivalent to courses offered in the desired curriculum at Drexel and you must have completed the courses with a grade of C (C=2.0) or better. The transfer courses listed should be used as a general guide and might not be acceptable for every major at the University. We make every effort to keep this guide current but cannot guarantee that every course will be acceptable for transfer. The number of credits you can transfer will be determined by the academic department once you've been accepted.*
