For general education elective options at NOVA, Drexel recommends equivalent courses in communications, english, music, sociology, psychology, fine arts, foreign languages, philosophy, history, political science, natural science and anthropology. For business electives at NOVA, Drexel recommends ACC 231, ECO 201 and ECO 202. Please refer to CollegeTransfer.net for course equivalents.

For students enrolling in the business program at Drexel, a maximum of 90 quarter credits will transfer and out of the 90 quarter credits only 28 quarter credits in business (or 7 required business courses) will transfer. Those courses include Intro to Business, Financial and Managerial Accounting, Business Law, Statistics, and Macro/Micro Economics. Also, a total of 28 Free Electives are required for the Business curriculum, any additional free elective credits would be considered excess and would not apply towards graduation.

To receive transfer credit, the courses must be substantially equivalent to courses offered in the desired curriculum at Drexel and you must have completed the courses with a grade of C (C=2.0) or better. The transfer courses listed should be used as a general guide and might not be acceptable for every major at the University. We make every effort to keep this guide current but cannot guarantee that every course will be acceptable for transfer. The number of credits you can transfer will be determined by the academic department once you've been accepted.

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
