Students must complete all First Year Experiences courses, all Directions courses, pass the Praxis and have a minimum 2.50 GPA and an up-to-date electronic portfolio, **before** being accepted into the Clusters.

The Clusters would begin in the second half of the junior year and would be taken three semesters in succession.

Elementary Student Teaching and Childhood Studies Teaching Seminar require a minimum PSU cumulative grade point average of 2.70.

Students must take the Praxis I exam prior to admission to PSU and must successfully complete the exam before graduation from the two-year institution. Students shall also submit their Praxis I results to Plymouth State.

Students with the AA degree in Teacher Preparation must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50.
