Elementary Student Teaching and Childhood Studies Teaching Seminar require a minimum cumulative PSU grade point average of 2.70.

Students must take the Praxis I exam prior to admission to PSU and must successfully complete the exam before graduation from the two-year institution. Students shall also submit their Praxis I results to Plymouth.

Students with the AA degree in Teacher Preparation must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50.
