Andrew College Articulation Agreement Bachelor of Business Administration

- 1. The Bachelor of Business Administration Program will be open to Andrew College graduates with an Associate of Science in Business Administration degree. Students must have earned a minimum grade of C in each course in Area A and Area F and also a GPA of at least 2.5 for the combined coursework in Areas A and F.
- 2. Andrew College graduates will receive transfer credits for courses completed at Andrew College toward Columbus State University's general core requirements and program of study as indicated in #5 and #6 below.
- Students must satisfy residency and program required upper division hours to graduate from Columbus State University. The CSU BBA program has 3 hours of non-business electives. The CSU BBA program requires that students earn grades of "C" or better in Math 1111 College Algebra and Math 1125 Calculus or higher as prerequisites for certain upper division courses.
- 4. Maximum allowable credit hours for transfer from Andrew College to Columbus State University for the Business Administration Program will be 63 semester hours.
- 5. Articulated transfer courses from Andrew College shall be as provided below:

Columbus State University and Andrew College Articulation Agreement Early Childhood Education

- 1. The Bachelor of Science in Education, Early Childhood will be open to Andrew College graduates with an Associate of Science in Early Childhood Education degree and a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 to pursue the Bachelor of Science in Education, Early Childhood at Columbus State University.
- 2. Andrew College graduates will receive transfer credits for courses completed at Andrew College toward Columbus State University's general core requirements and program of study. Note: A minimum grade of "C" is required in Area A mathematics requirements, in Area D science requirements, and in all Area F requirements.
- 3. Regardless of the total number of semester credit hours allowed in transfer, a minimum of 30 semester hours must be taken in residence at Columbus State University after the student has qualified as a junior. Baccalaureate degrees require a minimum of 39 semester hours of upper division coursework (numbered 3000 or above).
- 4. Additional hours must be scheduled at Columbus State University to satisfy at least 129 semester hours required for graduation.
- 5. Prior to enrolling in upper level courses, Early Childhood Education majors must meet all requirements for admission to the Teacher Education Program. Requirements include satisfactory performance on the GACE Basic Skills examination or an exemption based upon satisfactory scores on the SAT, ACT or GRE tests, a completed background check, and a passing score on the Regents' Test.
- 6. EDU 227 Identification & Instruction of Exceptional Learners will transfer from Andrew College and count in Area G for SPED 2256 Introduction to the Exceptional Learner in General Education.

The Bachelor of Science in Mathematics Secondary Education Track will be open to Andrew College graduates with an Associate of Science in Secondary Mathematics Education degree and a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 to pursue the Bachelor of Science in Education Secondary Education Track at Columbus State University.
- 2. Andrew College graduates will receive transfer credits for courses completed at Andrew College toward Columbus State University's general core requirements and program of study. Note: A minimum grade of "C" is required in Area A and D mathematics requirements and in all Area F requirements.
- 3. Regardless of the total number of semester credit hours allowed in transfer, a minimum of 30 semester hours must be taken in residence at Columbus State University after the student has qualified as a junior. Baccalaureate degrees require a minimum of 39 semester hours of upper division coursework (numbered 3000 or above).
- 4. Additional hours must be scheduled at Columbus State University to satisfy at least 123-126 semester hours required for graduation.
- 5. Prior to enrolling in upper level education courses, Mathematics Secondary Education majors must meet all requirements for admission to the Teacher Education Program. Requirements include satisfactory performance on the GACE Basic Skills examination or an exemption based upon satisfactory scores on the SAT, ACT or GRE tests, a completed background check, and a passing score on the Regents' Test.

- 1. The CSU Servant Leadership Stipend Program will be open to Andrew College graduates who have completed the AndrewServes program and have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 as stipends are available. In the case that no stipends are available, AndrewServes graduates will enter through the Associate Program and will be eligible for stipends as they become available.
- 2. The CSU Servant Leadership Associate Program will be open to Andrew College graduates who have completed the AndrewServes program and have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0.
- 3. Andrew College graduates will receive transfer credits for Andrew's Servant Leadership (STL) courses completed at Andrew College toward Columbus State University's Servant Leadership requirements and program of study. Note: A minimum grade of "C" is required in all courses.
- 4. Maximum allowable credit hours for transfer from Andrew College to Columbus State University for the Servant Leadership Program will be 5 semester hours.
