

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
ST. LOUIS COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND
UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI**

OVERVIEW:

This formal program articulation agreement is made and entered into by the University of Missouri, hereinafter referred to as MU, and the St. Louis Community College, St. Louis, Missouri, hereinafter referred to as STLCC. By this agreement STLCC and MU express a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for student access to, and success in, higher education. By clarifying transfer policies and procedures which assure articulation between programs, the institutions seek to assist students in making a seamless transfer from the associate to the baccalaureate degree.

PURPOSE:

This agreement provides students who have earned an **Associate in Applied Science in Interior Design** at STLCC the opportunity to complete a **Bachelor of Science in Human Environmental Sciences in Architectural Studies with an Emphasis in Interior Design** at MU. Any STLCC student who has earned an Associate in Applied Science in Interior Design is guaranteed that MU will accept designated freshman and sophomore credits and will apply such to the BS HES in Architectural Studies with an emphasis in Interior Design in a manner consistent with the treatment of native students.

CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER:

Section I: Admissions and Matriculation to Mizzou

STLCC students maintaining continuous enrollment under this agreement will be afforded the same treatment and protection as MU native students enrolled under a specific catalog. Criteria for admissions to the degree program will be based on the catalog year the student enters STLCC.

Criteria for acceptance into MU for transfer students is based upon their past academic performance and the admissions requirements for the BS HES in Architectural Studies with an emphasis in Interior Design.

STLCC, upon request of students, will provide verification of completed courses to MU through its Admissions Office.

The transcripts of students transferring from STLCC will be evaluated by the Admissions office.

Transfer students from STLCC will have access to financial aid and student services on the same

basis as native students.

Minimum grade standards for academic progress and graduation from STLCC will be subject to no further review by MU. Similarly, minimum grade standards for admission to upper level emphasis area, academic progress, and graduation from the College of Human Environmental Sciences at MU and will not be subject to review by STLCC.

MU will apply the same academic progress and graduation standards to STLCC transfer students as those applicable to native students at MU.

Section II: Transfer of Credit and Admission to the Degree Program

A maximum of 70 credit hours will be accepted by MU from STLCC to be applied to the BS HES in Architectural Studies with an emphasis in Interior Design. Students must complete 30 of the last 36 hours in MU authored courses, enrolled in the Department of Architectural Studies of the College of Human Environmental Sciences.

Acceptance to the Interior Design program is based on design work and academic achievement in the three specified courses of ARCHST 1200 Drafting (3 cr), ART 1050 Drawing (3cr), and ARCHST 1100 Visual Design (two-dimensional design) (3 cr). Students may request feedback on their portfolio prior to submission for the formal review

After meeting pre-portfolio requirements (i.e., 2-D design, drawing, and drafting), students will apply for a portfolio review at the end of the Spring Semester in May when the Department's regular portfolio review is scheduled or during the Spring semester before the student intends to graduate from SLCC. If the quality of work is below standards, students may be required to take additional coursework or retake equivalent classes at MU to improve portfolio quality. Upon faculty review of portfolio from design coursework, and following regular procedures for MU applicants, a decision will be one of the following.

- non-acceptance to the professional program with course suggestions on improving portfolio.
- acceptance into the professional program with recommendations on the next level of coursework at MU.
- acceptance into the professional program for advanced placement at MU.

Advanced transfer coursework does **NOT** guarantee placement in advanced studio levels at MU.

History of past portfolio reviews indicates that a student's cumulative grade point is a good indicator of acceptance into, and completion of, the professional design program. As a result, the Department of Architectural Studies recommends a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA.

Section IV: Program Plan

Students falling under this program articulation agreement will be responsible for successfully completing the following requirements:



Should either party desire to discontinue this agreement, advance notification of two years will be required.


SIGNATURES:


