## University of Missouri Bachelor of Science in Biology Transfer Guide for Three Rivers Community College

This plan is intended only as a general guide based on requirements in the 2013-2014 University of Missouri undergraduate catalog. You will need to complete a total of 120 hours in order to graduate. It will take roughly 90 to 110 credit hours to fulfill the requirements specific to the degrees offered in Biological Sciences. You may use elective courses to bring your total credit hours to 120.

At least 30 of the hours must be in courses at the 3000-level or higher. (Biology 2200 and 2300 and Chemistry 2100, 2110 and 2130 may be used to meet the 3000-level requirement.)
