



Memorandum of Articulation

This articulation supplements the Summer, 2017 memorandum of understanding between Aiken Technical College and Coker College.

Specific provisions of this articulation are as follows.

- Students holding degrees from the Aiken Technical College program in Business (Management, Marketing) shall be eligible for direct admission into the Coker College Bachelor of Science in Business Management program, provided those students graduated in good standing from Aiken Technical College and completed all degree requirements as described in the Aiken Technical College academic catalog.
- All credits related to the Aiken Technical College degree will be transferrable, provided courses are completed with a grade of C or better, allowing students to enter Coker College with junior
- Any additional credits taken at Aiken Technical College or elsewhere will be reviewed for awarding of credit.
- Coker College will offer third and fourth year courses in general education and in the Business Management major to allow students to complete all remaining requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management.
- Coker College will endeavor to offer the above-mentioned courses in a two-year, scheduled cohort rotation in order to ensure a clearly defined path for students transferring by way of this articulation. This rotation of course will be provided by Coker College to Aiken Technical College.
- Students will be eligible to enter Coker College's online Bachelor of Science in Business Management. Students will be eligible to enter a cohort with major instruction delivered on-site at the Coker College main campus or other Coker College instructional locations.
- Aiken Technical College will notify Coker College of any changes to the prescribed requirements for its degrees in Business, so that Coker College may review to ensure continued compatibility.

Additional provisions of the standing memorandum of understanding between Aiken Technical College and Coker College will also apply.

All aspects of the program will be periodically reviewed by representatives of Coker College and Aiken Technical College. Any alterations or new program elements will be implemented when mutually agreed upon by the two institutions.
