AGREEMENT BETWEEN CLAFLIN UNIVERSITY AND AIKEN TECHNICAL COLLEGE

Leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing

I. INTRODUCTION

This agreement establishes a formal academic transfer mechanism between Aiken Technical College and Claflin University. Its purpose is to promote and facilitate the transfer of academic credit for specified courses taken by students while enrolled at Aiken Technical College in the Associate in Applied Science in Nursing, who desire to enter into the Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing program offered by Claflin University. The purpose of this agreement is to provide a seamless transition from the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing at Aiken Technical College to Claflin University's RN to BSN Program. This agreement will assist the state of SC in achieving its goals of increasing the number of BSN prepared nurses to 80% by 2020.

II. TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT

Under the terms of this agreement, Aiken Technical College agrees to join with Claflin University in a mutual effort to provide for enhanced educational opportunities for their students. This agreement will enable academically qualified students to pursue a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing subsequent to the completion of their studies at Aiken Technical College. For their part, Aiken Technical College agrees to offer courses that are academically equivalent to the lower division requirements (i.e. freshman and sophomore levels) of Claflin University's general education requirements and selected courses for Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing students. The offering of courses is subject to the proviso that such offerings can be economically justified through sufficient student enrollment at each respective institution.

Claflin University's RN to BSN program agrees that whenever any of the courses listed on the enclosed attachment are taught at Aiken Technical College such courses shall be adjudged as academically equivalent to the corresponding component courses contained in the RN to BSN degree.

A special Road Map (an individualized advising plan) will be developed by Claflin University and reviewed by AikenTechnical College for each student interested in Claflin University's baccalaureate degree program in Nursing. Students accepted into the agreement will use catalog requirements for both institutions in effect at the time of entry into Aiken Technical College.

This agreement shall become effective on the first day of FALL semester 2017. It shall be jointly reviewed annually by representatives of each institution, prior to the anniversary date of the agreement. Internally, the review shall be conducted by the Department Chair of Nursing at Aiken Technical College and Nursing Program Director at Claflin University to assess the overall range of courses (both in the major and for general education credit) at Claflin University to ensure continuity within the major.

III. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Aiken Technical College agrees that faculty teaching general education courses and those in the Nursing major which are part of this transfer agreement will have completed at least eighteen graduate semester hours in the respective discipline and hold at least a master's degree.

Students from Aiken Technical College who wish to continue their studies in the Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing must make a formal application for admission to Claflin University prior to their official acceptance into that program. This involves a completed application, including an official copy of their transcripts from Aiken Technical College.

Upon receipt and evaluation of these transcripts by Claflin University, and provided that they are in good standing at Aiken Technical College (defined as having a GPA of at least 2.0 out of a 4.0 scale), and who are not otherwise ineligible to attend Claflin University for disciplinary or behavioral reasons, are assured of acceptance into the RN to BSN program offered by Claflin University.

Claflin University will accept the application and official transcripts and will grant transfer credit for courses shown on the enclosed Attachment. If the student has credits for courses which are not part of this agreement, but for which the student wishes to be granted transfer credit, an application for transfer credit for those courses must be completed, along with a copy of official transcripts from the institutions at which the courses were originally taken.

Students who have not completed all the courses outlined in this agreement may make an individual application to Claflin University. In these cases, the application will be evaluated and transfer credit granted, based on the transcript(s) from the institutions at which courses were originally taken and according to transfer credit policies in effect at the time.

Students having completed the Associate in Applied Science Degree at Aiken Technical College must also have passed the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX –RN) and obtained an unrestricted license to practice nursing in SC prior to full admission to Claflin University's RN to BSN program. Upon successful completion of the approved curriculum at Claflin University, Aiken Technical College transfer students shall be awarded a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from Claflin University.

Aiken Technical College shall designate appropriate members of their faculty as student advisors to counsel and assist students enrolled in the program for eventual transfer to Claflin University's Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing program. The Director of the Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing at Claflin University shall assist and cooperate in the advisement process as required to ensure close liaison with Aiken Technical College.

IV. Non-Discrimination Statement

In compliance with federal law, including the provisions of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Sections 503 and 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, each party hereto will not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, religion, color, national or ethnic origin, age, disability, military service or pregnancy in its administration of its policies, including admissions policies, employment, programs or activities.

V. TERMINATION

Either institution may terminate its participation in this agreement by submitting written notification to the other institution at least three months prior to termination, but subject to the proviso that such termination shall not become effective until the end of the current academic semester at the terminating member's institution. Students currently enrolled will be given up to four academic years to complete their program of study.

VI. AMENDMENTS TO THIS AGREEMENT

Claflin University and Aiken Technical College agree that this document constitutes the sole, full, and complete agreement between these institutions. No amendments, changes, additions, deletions, or modifications to or of this agreement shall be valid unless reduced to writing, signed by each institution's representative, and attached to this document.
