Successful completion of the 2+2 plan requires that a student remain continuously enrolled and graduate with the associate's degree from his or her respective community college. • This is a guide for course work in the major; actual course sequence may vary by student. Please refer to the online student degree evaluation. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the catalogs of their respective institutions and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly. • Academic plans and course schedules may need to be altered if ACT or Math Placement scores require a student to take pre-college courses (e.g., MATH 0900, 0921, or 0925) before taking required math or English courses.

#### Central Wyoming College requirements:

In order to graduate, students must successfully complete a minimum of 60 credit hours, with a minimum of 15 of the final 30 degree credits from Central Wyoming College. • All courses must be college-level courses as indicated by a number of 1000 or above. • A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better is required in all hours completed at CWC and in those courses required for graduation in a student's prescribed program. • A minimum of 2.0 (C) is required in general education course requirements and program requirements in the student's program of study. • An S/U graded course will not accepted to fulfill a general education or program requirement unless the course is offered S/U only.

#### University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate.Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming.Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U.

#### UW College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to UW's University Studies Program requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

#### **CWC Criminal Justice Program Notes:**

1 **Humanities Elective.** Choose one (1) from the following courses: HIST 2320 (History of Islam), RELI 1000 (Introduction to Religion), or RELI 2320 (History of Islam).

### UW Criminal Justice Program Notes:

• Students transferring to UW with an AA degree must complete the University Studies Program Communication 3 (C3) requirement, as well as courses fulfilling the College of Arts and Sciences core requirements of Diversity in the US and Global Awareness. • All criminal justice, communications (C3), and math courses taken at UW must be completed with a grade of C or better.

\* A single language must be taken for eight (8) hours or two (2) semesters to fulfill the foreign language requirement for the program.

\*\* Criminal justice students are required to complete two (2) courses from each of two (2) core areas:

**CRMJ Crime and Deviance courses** (6 hrs): CRMJ 3250 (Juvenile Delinquency), CRMJ 3500 (Drugs and the Criminal Justice System), CRMJ 4151 (Crime Causation), CRMJ 4260 (Gangs), CRMJ 4700 (Global Terrorism), or CRMJ 4890 (Serial Killers).

**CRMJ Institutions & Processes courses** (6 hrs): CRMJ 4130 (Leadership & Management in Criminal Justice), CRMJ 4140 (Criminal Legal Procedure), CRMJ 4150 (Community-Based Corrections), CRMJ 4280 (Comparative Criminal Justice), or CRMJ 4860 (Social Inequality, Crime, & Criminal Justice).

**\*\*\* CRMJ Supporting Course** (3 hrs). An additional course from the CRMJ Crime & Deviance or CRMJ Institutions & Processes lists above can satisfy this requirement; however, there are other options available. Please consult with an academic advisor.

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
