1. Course satisfies a major requirement at Temple.
2. The CCP AA in Liberal Arts requires MATH 118 or higher. MATH 251 satisfies a major requirement at Temple and is recommended. Students selecting other courses may need additional semesters to complete the degree.
3. Students should select PSYC 101, SOC 101, POLS 111, and ECON 181 or ECON 182 to satisfy Social Science Cluster and/or Social Science Electives at CCP. These courses will satisfy major requirements at Temple.
4. Students should select BIOL 106 for their Science with a lab at CCP. This course will satisfy the BIOL 1001 requirement for the BSW at Temple.
5. Students should select BHHS 101, 105 and 111 to satisfy General Electives at CCP. These courses will satisfy major requirements at Temple.
6. Students who complete the A.A. in Liberal Arts – Social Behavioral Science Option at CCP are included in the CCP-Temple Gen Ed-to-Gen Ed Transfer Agreement, and therefore, have satisfied all of the GenEd requirements at Temple. Students should consult with their CCP academic advisor to select the appropriate courses for the Associate Degree in Liberal Arts – Social/ Behavioral Science Option.

If the suggested classes are successfully completed and an Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts is awarded from CCP, the remaining two years in the BSW Program follows:
