RSC Admission Requirements for Pre-Occupational Therapy Students

RSC agrees to accept for transfer into the BS in Interdisciplinary Studies leading to the MS in Occupational Therapy up to 60 credit hours earned by a female student at Schenectady County Community College who takes the courses listed below. Only courses with earned grades of C- or better will transfer. Schenectady County Community College women who

- (i) complete courses listed below with grades of C- or better;
- (ii) who attain a combined grade point average (GPA) of 2.75; and
- (iii) who attain a GPA of 2.75 in the four occupational therapy prerequisite science courses will be automatically admitted into the RSC Interdisciplinary program.

For Accelerated entry into the Occupational Therapy Program:

Qualified students may accelerate into the MS in OT Program by enrolling in and completing first year occupational therapy courses in place of fourth year undergraduate electives. The BS in Interdisciplinary Studies degree is awarded at the end of the fourth year, and the MS degree in Occupational Therapy at the end of graduate coursework and fieldwork. To qualify, students must:

1. Attain a 3.0 RSC GPA (to be reviewed at the close of the fall and spring semesters, prior to entering the OT Program)
2. Attain a 2.75 GPA in the OT Program science prerequisite courses (Anatomy & Physiology I and II; Physics I & II)
3. Complete all major courses, RSC general education requirements and OT Program prerequisite courses by the end of the third year (or equivalent)

Students who need extra time to improve their grade point averages can take an additional year of undergraduate study to complete their baccalaureate degrees and reapply to the graduate OT Program.

Procedures for Acceleration into the MS in OT Program

By **January 15** of the third year (or equivalent) of undergraduate academic study, students who are accelerating into the MS in OT Program will complete or provide the following to the OT Department:

- 1) Arrange for an interview with OT Program faculty
- 2) Complete the following OT Program admission forms: Academic Standards Statement, Student Information Form, Clinical Observation Document (these are available at <http://www.sage.edu/departments/ot/admission.html>)
- 3) Submit current resume
- 4) Provide transcripts from all college institutions attended
- 5) Provide a list of courses in progress and planned during the third undergraduate year
