This is not an articulation agreement. This chart should serve as a reference for Greenfield Community College students who eventually plan to transfer to Western New England College. We hope that this will aid you in working towards your academic goals and maximize the transfer credit applied towards a degree at Western New England College. Please reference our College Catalogue for additional information. A maximum of 70 semester hours may be transferred from two-year institutions. The School of Business requires that at least 50% of the business credit hours be earned at Western New England College. The Business Administration Transfer Option will serve as an excellent option for students interested in transferring into any of following majors offered at Western New England College: Accounting, Business Information Systems, Finance, General Business, Management, Marketing, Marketing Communication/Advertising, and Sport Management.

Business courses from a college not accredited by AACSB that are determined to be equivalent to 300-400 level courses at Western New England College will be considered for transfer credit (up to one course). With this in mind, the College will apply credit for one course that is required for the intended major. One additional course identified as equivalent to a 300-400 level course at Western New England College will be considered for transfer credit as a business elective if the course does not satisfy a specific requirement for the intended major.

<sup>\*</sup> The following Greenfield Community College courses will count towards satisfying Western New England College's general College requirements: Any history course (one), any natural lab science (two), MAT 114 Introduction to Statistics, MAT 151 Applied Calculus I, MAT 201 Calculus with Analytic Geometry I, MAT 202 Calculus with Analytic Geometry II. Students are encouraged to complete the MAT 201 & 202 sequence prior to enrolling at Western New England College. Other courses will be considered for transfer credit as Non-Business Electives (up to 6-9 credits).

- 1) Western New England College will produce a degree audit for all students accepted in the Joint Admission Program. The audit will be based upon a current copy of an official Greenfield Community College transcript, and/or a list of in progress course work. An updated copy will be produced each time an updated official transcript is presented. The degree audit should be used as the official document to determine what degree requirements remain to be satisfied.
- 2) Western New England College may not be able to apply towards the curriculum credit that is not specified as eligible for a specific major offered through the Joint Admissions Program. Students are subject to transfer credit restrictions as noted in the Western New England College Catalogue.
- \* Students may have satisfied some of these requirements through elective courses taken at Greenfield Community College. To ensure that the maximum number of credits is applied towards a bachelor's degree at Western New England College, students are encouraged to select recommended courses provided on page 1 of this transfer guide.
