Students who have not taken at least two college prep math courses in high school and earned at least a "C", should enroll in a 100 level math course or the necessary remedial courses and earn at least a "C".

<sup>\*\*</sup>Any Greenfield Community College course without an equivalent Western New England College course will transfer as a General Elective (up to 6-9 credits). The degree audit should be used as the official document to determine what degree requirements remain to be satisfied.
